

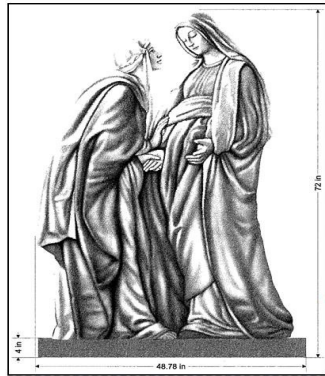
## Replacement School

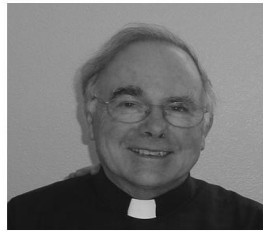

**Fr. Scott Vandehey Memorial Statue**



Fr. Scott dedicated 52 years of his life to the priesthood serving thousands of his people throughout the Archdiocese of Portland.

**Donations are needed to give back and honor Fr. Scott** by dedicating a 6 foot statue of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in his memory.

The statue cost is \$13,000 and will be carved out of granite and placed at the school. A mason will create a two-foot pedestal for the statue to rest upon and at the foot of the pedestal will be a plaque that says *“Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth, in loving memory of Rev. Scott Vandehey 1939-2018.*

**From the Desk of Fr. Michael**

This weekend, the March for Life in Washington, DC occurred once again as hundreds of thousands in support of life from natural conception to natural death gathered to proclaim the Gospel message of Life.

This year's theme was "Unique From Day One: Pro-Life is Pro-Science." Jeanne Mancini, president of the March for Life Education and Defense, shared that this theme was selected because "Our DNA is present at the moment of fertilization...Science should always be at the service of life, not the reverse."

For this reason, there has been a movement especially supported financially by Pro-Life groups such as Knights of Columbus to raise awareness and funds to purchase 3D and 4D ultrasound equipment to be donated to Pregnancy help centers.

The Ultrasound initiative is a program that reveals how Science is at the service of life. Due to the advancements in modern medical science and technology, an ultrasound can reveal within a few weeks of conception (about 3 to 5 weeks) a heartbeat. This is not only a clear indication of life but also the development of life in the womb itself.

Furthermore, data has shown that 78% of pregnant mothers seeing the Truth of a heartbeat and life growing in her womb have chosen Life. The reason why a heartbeat changes minds and hearts is because culturally speaking, the heart speaks to a part of our humanity that cannot deny that the heart is symbolic of love. The heart, like in Chinese culture which expresses language in characters, the heart means not only love but of connection and relationship. In African cultures, the heart represents the soul and core of a person.

In other words, science supports thousands upon thousands of years of Truth for most if not all cultures in the world that the heart and the heartbeat that allows blood to flow within us is a sign of life and the gift of life that needs to be safeguarded and protected in our laws from the womb to the tomb.


