MISSION APPEAL: We will have a Missionary from PIME speaking at Masses on the weekend of August 26th and 27th. His name is Brother Marco Monti, PIME. Brother Marco Monti is from Bovisio Masciago, Milan (Italy) and graduated from the Milan State University with a degree in Political Science with a specialization in Economics. He joined PIME in February 1994, and followed a training program for missionary laymen. From October 1995 to September 1997, he worked on rural development projects with PIME in Cambodia. He took his vows as a PIME religious brother in August 1999, and was sent to Thailand a month later as a lay missionary. From October 1999 to August 2001, he studied the Thai language and culture in Bangkok. From September 2001 to September 2013, he was the director of the “St. Joseph Centre for Disabled People” in Phrae Province, Northern Thailand. In May 2013, he was elected a member of PIME's Directorate, as an Assistant General. He currently works in Rome and has the duty of visiting and helping PIME's missions all over the world, with special attention on Asia.
