**HOPE HOUSE OF PICKAWAY COUNTY**

In the Spring of last year, local churches and community members came together to address the homeless shelter situation for men, and men with families, in Pickaway County. Aside from Haven House, which shelters women and children, there wasn't a place in Pickaway County for homeless men, or men with families, to stay to meet basic needs like food, shelter, water, showers, clean restrooms, and laundry services.

As a result, our community came together to open Hope House of Pickaway County at 2146 N. Court Street (formerly known as The Circle Shelter) as an emergency overnight shelter for men, and men with families, open from 6:00 p.m.-8:00 a.m., seven days a week. A soft opening occurred in November and 318 people have been served up to the Open House on January 6, 2019.

Funds are needed to continue the essential services provided by Hope House. As a result, **St. Joseph Parish has decided to add Hope House as a collection for the month of February. You will see a special envelope in your current packet. Please consider your support of Hope House.**

**The National Catholic Youth Conference** is a powerful, biennial, three-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for Catholic teenagers (of high school age) and their adult chaperones. More than 21,000 young people and their chaperones attended 2017 NCYC in Indianapolis. The 2019 National Catholic Youth Conference is November 21-24, back in Indianapolis, with the theme Blessed • Broken • Given; Bendito • Partido • Entregado.

Teens interested in attending should contact their youth minister, Vanessa Butterbaugh. **Registration begins March 1, 2019.** Cost is between \$515-700 depending on the accommodations that you pick. **Celebrating the Saints: *St. Gertrude Caterina Comensoli***

Gertrude was born Catherine to an Italian Catholic family with ten children; however, only three girls survived, including Catherine. She joined the Society of St. Angela Merici after secretly receiving her First Communion in 1867, and then founded (several years later) the Institute of the Sisters Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament (which was the origin of the Sisters Sacramentine), taking the name Sr. Gertrude. **Despite bouts of illness and hardship, which became impediments to her dream of honoring Jesus in the Eucharist through a religious order, she persevered and continued to listen to God's call for her life.** The charisms she was most known for included prayer, sacrifice, mortification, obedience, humility, and charity (toward the poor). St. Gertrude was canonized in 2009 by Pope Benedict XVI, and her feast day is **February 18.**
