#### **Centennial News**

Pope Chooses Lafayette's First Bishop—On July 18, 1918 the Archdiocese of New Orleans received an important letter form Pope Benedict XV. The Holy Father signed the order appointing Jules B. Jeanmard as the first Bishop of the Diocese of Lafayette on July 4, 1918. The Pope had created the Diocese almost 6 months earlier on January 11th, but no Bishop had been named. Many suspected that Fr. Teurlings may have been named bishop, but the 38 year old native of Breaux Bridge was chosen. Jeanmard was shocked to receive the news, and wrote to a friend proclaiming: "(I am still hoping against hope that it may not be true...Poor Lafayette is getting a sorry specimen for its first shepherd."
