Saint of the Week: John the Evangelist died c. 100 (*Feast December 27*). John and James were Galilean fisherman called from mending their nets to follow Jesus, who nicknamed them "sons of thunder." Along with Peter, the brothers were in Jesus' inner circle, witnessing his transfiguration and agony in the Gethsemane. John, always "the beloved disciple" in tradition, was given the care of Mary on Calvary. In later years, he was exiled on Patmos, and reportedly died at a great age in Ephesus. Authorship of the fourth Gospel, three New Testament letters and the Book of Revelation are attributed to John and his followers.
