Stations of the Cross: Every Fridays 11:30am and 7:00pm during lent. The Stations of the Cross is a Lenten devotion that offers witness to Jesus' Passion and Death. At each station we use our senses and our imagination to reflect prayerfully upon Jesus' suffering, Death, and Resurrection, and to simply experience the visual images to reflect on Christ's love for us.

Easter Flowers: Remember your loved ones at Easter with an Easter Flower Memorial offering by using the envelopes located on the church tables or in your mailing. The names of the deceased will be remembered at Easter and listed in our bulletin.

Saint of the week: Louise de Marillac 1590-1660. (Feast March 15). Born in Auvergne, France, Louise married an



official of the royal court, Antoine Le Gras. Following his death in 1625, and despite strained finances and bouts of melancholy, she was an active supporter of St. Vincent de Paul's charitable works and became co-founder with him of the Daughters of

Charity. She drew up the first draft of their rule. By the time of her death, the order had established 40 houses in France, and Daughters of Charity were looking after the sick poor in Parisian parishes and sheltering hundreds of women.

Next Youth Group Event: This Sunday March 10. Parish teens (and their friends) in grades 7-12 are encouraged to help us assemble 350 meal kits as part of Catholic Charities' "Cup of Joe" program that provides breakfast to the homeless. Respect Life News: Representative Chris Smith (R-N.J.), co-chairman of the bipartisan Congressional pro-life Caucus, addressed the House of Representatives on February 12. We draw extensively on his remarks for this week's bulletin. Representative Smith began: "Madam Speaker, in 2012, two bioethicists-Dr. Alberto Giubilini" of Oxford University "and Francesca Minerva" of the University of Melbourne "-published an" article "in the Journal of Medical Ethics, justifying the deliberate, premeditated murder of newborn babies during the first hours, days and even weeks after birth. The ethicists said: 'When circumstances occur after birth that would have justified an abortion, what we call after-birth abortion [!] should be permissible.' In other words, the same conditions that would justify the killing of a baby in utero justify the killing of that baby even when she is born. The infanticide that they proposed... is here. After-birth abortion is here ...; we cannot look away when a child's fundamental human rights are being violated with such lethal actions. Pass the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act now. Madam Speaker, give us that chance to vote on this." Recently, "New York Governor Cuomo signed into law a bill to allow abortion until birth; it even removes penalties for infanticide.... Virginia, Rhode Island and New Mexico have similar anti-child statutes under consideration. The violent assault on children, Madam Speaker, must end...Not only have over 61 million unborn babies been killed since 1973...—a death toll that equates with the entire population of Italy-but pro-choice" advocates are" legislating to extend the violence after birth....we cannot look away when a child's fundamental human rights are being" so lethally denied. Tragically, on February 14, House Democrats for the sixth time blocked a request by Republicans to vote on the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act ("National Right to Life News Today," February 14, 2019; lifenews.com, February 18, 2019).
