The woman who took heart in Jesus

Scripture: Mark 5:21-43

And when Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered about him; and he was beside the sea. Then came one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name; and seeing him, he fell at his feet, and begged him, saying, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." And he went with him. And a great crowd followed him and thronged about him.

And there was a woman who had had a flow of blood for twelve years, and who had suffered much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather grew worse. She had heard the reports about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment. For she said, "If I touch even his garments, I shall be made well." And immediately the hemorrhage ceased; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. And Jesus, perceiving in himself that power had gone forth from him, immediately turned about in the crowd, and said, "Who touched my garments?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing around you, and yet you say, "Who touched me?"" And he looked around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had been done to her, came in fear and trembling and fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

While he was still speaking, there came from the ruler's house some who said, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the Teacher any further?" But ignoring what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." And he allowed no one to follow him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. When they came to the house of the ruler of the synagogue, he saw a tumult, and people weeping and wailing loudly. And when he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a tumult and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. But he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. 41 Taking her by the hand he said to her, "Talitha cumi"; which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise." And immediately the girl got up and walked (she was twelve years of age), and they were immediately overcome with amazement. And he strictly charged them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

Meditation: Do you approach the Lord Jesus with expectant faith or with skeptical doubt? People in desperate or helpless circumstances were not disappointed when they sought Jesus out. What drew them to Jesus? Was it hope for a miracle or a word of comfort in their affliction? What did the elderly woman who had suffered miserably for twelve years expect Jesus to do for her? And what did a grieving father expect Jesus to do for his beloved daughter who was at the point of death? Jesus gave hope where there seemed to be no human cause for it because his hope was directed to God. He spoke words of hope to the woman (Take heart, daughter!) to ignite the spark of faith in her (your faith has made you well!).

REFLECTION

We're all familiar with the remote control of a TV. There are various buttons which play different roles. There is a button named "Mute" that's used to put off sound momentarily.

Sometimes in our spiritual lives we undergo the experience of being in the mute mode with God. There is a total "silence" that pervades our relationship with God. For example, the couple, Zachariah and Elizabeth, the underwent this "mute" experience with God. They were advanced in age, always living a life of prayer, service and faithfulness, but were not blessed with a child. She was barren, and being childless in the Jewish tradition, was looked upon unfavorably, often publicly embarrassed and ridiculed. Then came the precious and joyous moment in their old age, they were blessed with a child. The birth of John, new life and fresh joy radiated in their lives.

The name Zachariah means "the Lord remembers." Elizabeth means "the oath of God." The Lord remembers His oath. John means " God is gracious." We see in this couple, as in our own lives, God's "delays" are certainly not his "denials." He has a better plan always, without fail.

MARRIAGE MINUTE

What are your top priorities for your children?

Is it health? A good education? Trustworthy friends? For most parents, the scariest scenario is the health of our children and everything else comes secondary, but Jesus rearranges those priorities in this week's Gospel.
