### TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

August 19, 2018



**" "He who eats this bread will live forever"**

*Scripture: John 6:51-58*

*I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me. This is the bread which came down from heaven, not such as the fathers ate and died; he who eats this bread will live forever."*

*Meditation: Why did Jesus offer himself as "food and drink"? The Jews were scandalized and the disciples were divided when Jesus said "unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you have no life in you." What a hard saying, unless you understand who Jesus is and why he calls himself the bread of life. The miracle of the multiplication of the loaves (John 6:3-13), when Jesus said the blessing, broke and distributed the loaves through his disciples to feed the multitude, is a sign that prefigured the superabundance of the unique bread of the Eucharist, or Lord's Supper. The Gospel of John has no account of the Last Supper meal (just the foot washing ceremony and Jesus' farewell discourse).  
Instead, John quotes extensively from Jesus' teaching on the bread of life.*

*In the Old Covenant bread and wine were offered in a thanksgiving sacrifice as a sign of grateful acknowledgment to the Creator as the giver and sustainer of life. Melchizedek, who was both a priest and king (Genesis 14:18; Hebrews 7:1-4), offered a sacrifice of bread and wine. His offering prefigured the offering made by Jesus, our high priest and king (Hebrews 7:26; 9:11; 10:12). The remembrance of the manna in the wilderness recalled to the people of Israel that they live - not by earthly bread alone - but by the bread of the Word of God (Deuteronomy 8:3).*

*Jesus made himself a perfect offering and sacrifice to God on our behalf At the last supper when Jesus blessed the cup of wine, he gave it to his disciples saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins" (Matthew 26:28). Jesus was pointing to the sacrifice he was about to make on the cross, when he would shed his blood for us - thus pouring himself out and giving himself to us - as an atoning sacrifice for our sins and the sins of the world. His death on the cross fulfilled the sacrifice of the paschal (passover) lamb whose blood spared the Israelites from death in Egypt.*

**REFLECTION:**

**Scripture: John 6:41-51**

We are the people who love to complain. We are a people who love to murmur. We all do our fair share of complaining, and sometimes with great reason. We complain about the weather a great deal, and all kinds of things, and sometimes about nothing.

The Gospel starts by saying "as soon as the Lord said to the Jews that 'I am the Bread of Life came down from heaven' the Jews murmured to one another." They complained to one another. How can this be, we know his parents, Joseph and Mary...they could not recognize the divinity of Jesus.

When the mind is filled with complaints, the heart is already closed. And when the mind is filled with complaints, then life can be a pain, and life then does not grow.

God offers his people abundant life, but we can miss it. Let us not murmur or complain. When the mind is filled with complaints, there is stumbling block between God and us.

**MARRIAGE MINUTE**

Work, homework, school activities ... these things are all gearing into high speed. Most of us have heard how important family dinners are, but it is hard to make them happen!

In this weekend's readings, Wisdom invites people for dinner and Jesus feeds us on his own Body and Blood. In this context, simple meals together have elevated meaning and are opportunities to grow in our faith and our love for each other. If scheduling is a challenge, try:

- Get up early and do breakfast together
- Keep one or more nights per week free from outside commitments
- Even if everyone can't be present for a meal, pray as a group for anyone absent

If you don't have kids, or they have left home, don't discount the importance of family dinner for you as a couple!
