"The Son of man will come with great power and glory"

Scripture: Mark 13:24-32

"But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of man coming in clouds with great power and glory. And then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away before all these things take place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. "But of that day or that hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

Old Testament Reading: Daniel 12:1-3

At that time shall arise Michael, the great prince who has charge of your people. And there shall be a time of trouble, such as never has been since there was a nation till that time; but at that time your people shall be delivered, every one whose name shall be found written in the book. 2 And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. 3 And those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the firmament; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

Meditation: Do you recognize the signs of God's kingdom - signs that point to his power and action in our lives and in the world around us? The Lord Jesus came to bring us the kingdom of God and to set us free from bondage to sin, death, and destruction and from the powers of the evil one who tempts us through lies and deception.

The Lord is preparing us for his return

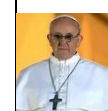
Jesus told his first disciples that it was for their benefit that he return to his Father in heaven in order for the Holy Spirit to come (John 16:7) and fill the earth with the fire of God's love, truth, and glory. The Lord Jesus in every age fills his people with the power of the Holy Spirit so that each one of us can hear his voice, understand his truth, and sow the seeds of his word - the good news of the Gospel - wherever he sends us. The Lord Jesus is preparing his people for his return - for the day of "tribulation" and "shaking" when he will appear "coming in clouds with great power and glory"

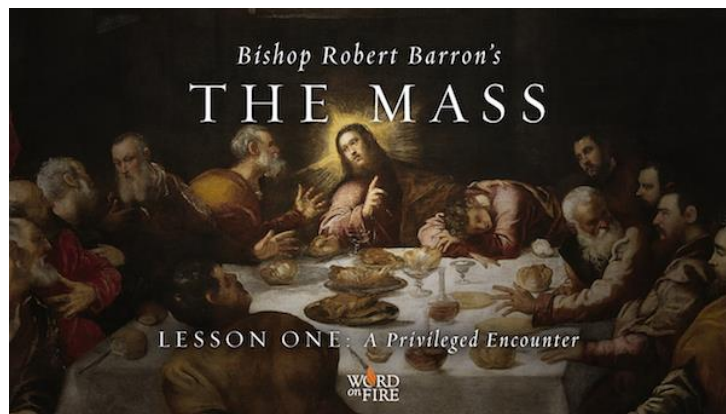
THE ARCHBISHOP'S CAPITAL CAMPAIGN is wrapping up for Annunciation and St. Francis parishes. Please turn in your pledge cards by November 30. Thanks to everyone who have returned their cards and for your generosity in this campaign.

FATHER JOE will be gone November 21-23. There will be mass on Tuesday, November 20, at 8 a.m. instead of 6:30 p.m., no mass on Wednesday and Thursday, November 21-22, and 9 a.m. mass will resume on Saturday, November 24.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS will be held in St. Ann's Hall and are open to both Annunciation and St. Francis parishes.

***Wednesday, November 28, 7 p.m.,** in St. Ann's Hall, Kevin Pyle, parishioner from Annunciation, will give a presentation on the "Camino de Santiago de Compostela" in northern Spain. The Camino was a sacred pilgrimage to visit the remains of St James the Apostle enshrined in the cathedral at Santiago. An estimated one million pilgrims walked the Camino across Europe in the 9th to 15th centuries to seek the help of St James. Today, thousands of modern pilgrims make their way along this United Nations educational, science & cultural organization world heritage site, and this presentation shows what Kevin and Mary Jo experienced on their 500 mile walk on the Camino last Fall. We hope you will join us!

***Wednesday, December 5, at 7 p.m.,** we will begin showing the DVD series "The Mass" by Bishop Robert Barron weekly in St. Ann's Hall. This series will run through every Wednesday in Advent, as we prepare our hearts during this holy season. More information will be posted in the bulletin.
