

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 25, 2018



“My kingship is not of this world”

Scripture: John 18:33-37

Pilate entered the praetorium again and called Jesus, and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me; what have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingship is not of this world; if my kingship were of this world, my servants would fight, that I might not be handed over to the Jews; but my kingship is not from the world." Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Every one who is of the truth hears my voice."

Old Testament Reading: Daniel 7:13-14

I saw in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him. 14 And to him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed.

Meditation: Do you recognize that the Lord Jesus have been given all authority and power to reign over heaven and earth? Jesus was crucified for his claim to be the Messiah King (John 18:37) who would rule not only over his people Israel but ultimately over all the nations as well (Daniel 7:13-14).

God is King and Ruler over all

What is the significance or meaning of Jesus' kingship for us? Kingship today seems antiquated, especially in democratic societies where everyone is treated equal and free. God at first did not want to give his people Israel a king. Why? Because God alone was their King and they needed no other. Nonetheless, God relented and promised his people that through David's line he would establish a Ruler and a Kingdom that would last for eternity (Psalm 89:29).

The Jews understood that the Messiah ("Anointed One") would come as God's anointed King to restore paradise and establish God's reign of everlasting peace for them. They wanted a Messianic King who would free them from strife and division and from foreign oppression. Many had high hopes that Jesus would be the Messiah and Ruler for Israel. Little did they understand what kind of kingship Jesus claimed to possess.



Each year at this time, the Church invites us to meditate on the "last things" – Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell -- as they apply to us. How long do you have to live? The truth is, none of us know. But when our final day comes it is unlikely that we can negotiate an extension. That is why each year as Advent draws near the church puts before us images of the end of the world.

There are only three questions that will matter as we face eternity. All three questions are about love:

1. Did I let love in?
2. Did I give love away?
3. Did I choose love even when it was difficult?

If we can answer to these three questions positively, we can close our eyes in peace and satisfaction.

We can also have the confidence that we have found the door to eternity. That is why it is a foolish thing to postpone dealing with these questions until we reach our deathbed.

Are you still eating turkey? The first turkey sandwich the day after Thanksgiving is great, but if you were forced to eat nothing but leftovers until Christmas, the menu would get old fast.

There are times in marriage, such as immediately following the birth of a child, or while the family is dealing with a loss, that we need to give our spouse our "leftover" time, energy and attention. While this is understandable, if it becomes a habit, our spouses will begin to feel unimportant.

To keep this from becoming a bad habit, try:

- Sharing your feelings regularly.
