What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Understood simply, Eucharistic Adoration is adoring or honoring the Eucharistic Presence of Christ. In a deeper sense, it involves "the contemplation of the Mystery of Christ truly present before us".

During Eucharistic Adoration, we "watch and wait", we remain "silent" in His Presence and open ourselves to His Graces which flow from the Eucharist. By worshiping the Eucharistic Jesus, we become what God wants us to be! Like a magnet, The Lord draws us to Himself and gently transforms us.

In its fullest essence ... Eucharistic Adoration is "God and Man reaching out for each other, at the same time!"

In an effort to strengthen our relationship with the Lord, St. Teresa's will be offering Adoration at the following times, beginning August 12, 2017:

Monday & Wednesday from 6:00-7:00pm
Tuesday & Thursday from 9:00-10:00am
Friday from 7:00-8:00pm

Monday through Thursday will be silent adoration. Friday night will be a special Holy Hour called **Inspire**.

Inspire will include Praise & Worship, a short meditation, and Reconciliation will be available. There will also be a social for the students afterward, and we would like to invite you and your family to join us for the social on the first Friday of each month. That First Friday Social will be a game night and feel free to bring snacks and other goodies to share.

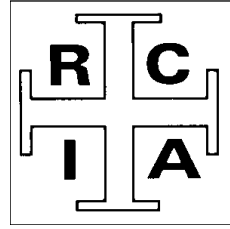
Like the saying goes, "It's not what you know, but who you know." Similarly, in regards to the Church, it's not solely about what you know but community and the question of who you know makes a difference!

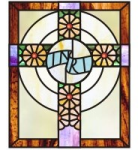
**Northwest Indiana

Greetings! My name is Chris Blane. My husband, Mark and I have been members of St. Teresa's for the past 20 years.

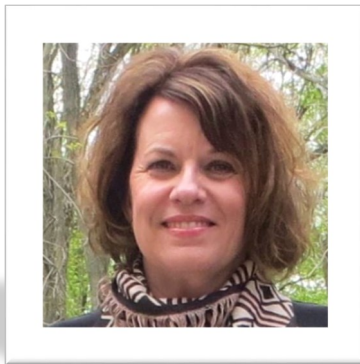
