Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning.

Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation and asks for an increase of peace.

2. An Intensely Ordered System

Unharnessed, the great natural sources of power run to waste. Likewise, zeal unsystematic, enthusiasm undirected, never bring large results, interior or exterior, and seldom are durable. Aware of this, the Legion places before its members a mode of life rather than the doing of a work. It provides an intensely ordered system, in which much is given the force of rule that in other systems is merely exhorted or left to be understood, and regarding every detail of which it enjoins a spirit of scrupulous observance. It promises, in return, perseverance and conspicuous growth in the qualities of Christian perfection, namely, faith, love of Mary, fearlessness, self-sacrifice, fraternity, prayerfulness, prudence, patience, obedience, humility, gladness, and the apostolic spirit.

"The growth of what is usually designated the Lay Apostolate is a special manifestation of our modern days, possessing—were it for no other reason than the numbers concerned—infinite potentialities. Yet, insufficient seems the provision for this giant movement. When one looks upon the multitude of beautifully conceived Orders which cater for those who can abandon the world, the contrast with the form of organization thought good enough for those who are not so circumstanced, is very striking. On the one hand, what intensity and exact science, making the most of the material! On the other, how elementary and superficial is the provision made! The system calls, indeed, for some service from its members, but it forms for the generality of them little more than an incident in the week's round, and it hardly even endeavors to play a more considerable part. There must be a higher conception of it. Should it not be the staff of their earthly pilgrimage—the very backbone of their whole spiritual life? Undoubtedly the Religious Order must form the pattern for workers in common and, other things being equal, it may be taken that the quality of the work done will improve in the measure that there is approximation to the Order idea. Still this brings with it the difficulty of determining the exact degree of rule which is to be imposed. Desirable though discipline is in the interests of efficiency, there is always the danger of overdoing it, and narrowing the appeal of the organization. The fact must be borne in mind that the object in view is permanent lay organization—not something equivalent to a new Religious Order, or which would eventually drift into becoming one, and of which history is full of instances. The aim is this, and no other: the drawing into efficient organization of persons living their ordinary life as we know it, and in whom the presence of various tastes and pursuits other than purely religious ones has to be allowed for. The amount of regulation attempted should be no more than will be accepted by the average of the class for whom the organization is intended, but it should certainly be nothing less." (Father Michael Creedon, the first Spiritual Director of Concilium Legionis Mariae)

'An intensely Ordered System" (Chapter 11,2 LOM Manual)

Allocutio by Fr. Victor Perez August 12,2018

This Wednesday we celebrate the Assumption of Mary. This is our Holy Mother bodily in Heaven. It is she who walks with us always. She walks with us as we seek to serve the mystical body of Christ. She is active in our lives and wants us to be active, active seeking to serve Her Son. Like Mary we should be empty of self and magnify the Lord. We are called as Legionaries to have this virtue of obedience to the Legion way of life. How blessed we are as Legionaries to be called to live our faith during the day to day. The reading says the Legion is meant to give us a way of life. A way of life in which we live close to our Mother and to Our Lord and we serve him with others (where two are gathered in my name I am in the midst of them). This is the virtue of "fraternity." We are not alone. In a world where there is much more floor space per person, and more individualism, where our neighbors are farther geographically away from us especially if you have a big front yard, it might be hard to reach out to a brother or sister to go and do a Legionary work as a pair. The legion calls us to this virtue of fraternity. When we do a job, this time is sacred and we are offering ourselves to Our Lady to serve Christ more perfectly. When we do it in obedience and with faith, we know God will act. Fruit will be bore. It is not dependent on apparent success or consolation, you will see in Heaven how much your Legionary works are pleasing to God. "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion for God loves a cheerful giver. " We need to do our legionary work with love, love for the Father who made us and called us to the Legion. We should do it cheerfully. The Legion is not over restrictive. It is not a religious order, we all have our own ordinary lives with our own tastes and differences, however we unite in an army set in battle array (Acies!). We extend the mercy of Jesus Christ to a world grown cold, with indifference, with individualism. We are servants of the Blessed Mother who is the Mother of the Church and we get to care for those who are forgotten. We get to reach people's homes by bringing them an image of the Virgin Mary or enthroning the Sacred Heart. In this way the Legion wants to form in families a religious spirit and in the hearts of children a Love for religion. We must not underestimate the importance of the Legion System, the prayer in community, the rosary, the daily prayer and offering of ourselves to be part of this "battle array" in our daily lives. It means we space out time every week to do our Legionary work, since we do this not alone but part of Mary's army. This should not be different than volunteering in the Church to do something. However, the Legionary volunteers to be a missionary to the world! Every week we get to live the mission of the Church in the way Jesus first envisioned it when he sent the apostles out to the world. We tell people of Jesus and become an image of His love and no one was a better image of that love than Mary our Mother. As we celebrate her Assumption let us remember that we who follow her path of faith and love for Jesus and living our total consecration to her will follow where she is in our true home in Heaven. Let us serve Heaven here on earth. God will repay us!

QUARTERLY REPORTS**DISTANT COUNCILS****NEW ORLEANS REGIA****Immaculata Regia**

The Immaculata Regia was pleased to be a part of the Deacon Conference in July. The conference was very well attended with over 2400 people registered. More details on the conference will be given in the next quarterly report. The Regia received a letter from Most Rev. Gregory Aymond, Archbishop of New Orleans, informing them that Fr. Raymond Lgbogidi will serve as Spiritual Director of the Regia. Fr. Raymond is the Pastor at St. Christopher the Martyr Parish in Metairie. The Regia continues to persevere in the area of extension with new Praesidia at Our Lady of Guadalupe and Resurrection of Our Lord Parishes.

Our Lady of the Rosary Praesidium gave their 44th Annual Report. Their Praesidium members attended several Legion functions including a "Morning of Reflection", conducted by Deacon. Traylor. **Our Lady of the Most Holy Eucharist** Praesidium gave their 5th Annual Report. On March 18, 2018 their Praesidium hosted the Acies with all seven active members and 15 of their Auxiliary members and their Spiritual Director in attendance. Among their many works, they provided religious gifts for the First Communion and Confirmation students.

Mary Queen of Peace Praesidium gave their 7th Annual Report. Principal works of the Praesidium are visiting the sick of the parish in nursing homes, hospitals, and at home. They participated in the Parish Ministry Fair.

Mary, Queen of the Family Praesidium gave their 19th Annual Report. A previous president of their Praesidium, Br. John Yike, is now studying for the Priesthood. Their treasurer's records were audited in June. Once a month they pray the Rosary in front of the Church. They place a Legion altar just inside the doors of the entrance of the church which is just a few feet from Dauphine Street. Sometimes people walking by stop and join them.

Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary-Sulphur gave their Quarterly Report. They reported that Father Nathan Long, Pastor of Our Lady of Good Council Parish and the McNeese Student Center, will visit Mary Mother of Hope Praesidium to learn more about the Legion of Mary and how it will work for them, especially as it may relate to college students.

Prompt Succor Curia-Baton Rouge gave their Quarterly Report. They reported that their Acies was held in St. Anthony's Parish on March 24h, and the celebration was a success. The works of their attached praesidia, **Our Lady of the Rosary** in St. Agnes Parish, include nursing home and hospital visitations, RCIA, Confirmation preparation, and Holy Communion to the homebound. **Our Lady of Grace** Comitium-Lafayette gave their Quarterly Report.

It was reported that Deacon Cody will have a retreat at Our Lady of the Nativity in New Iberia where he will extend an invitation to join the Legion to those attending. There is interest in starting a new Praesidium in Woodworth, Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Crowley, and a new Jr. Praesidium at Mater Dolorosa Church in Placerville.

Our Lady of Fatima Praesidium-Metairie Manor gave their 10th Annual Report. Metairie Manor is an affordable housing facility for seniors over 62 years old. Among the many wonderful works of this Praesidium, it was reported that one of the residents became a Catholic due to the teachings of their members.

Mary Queen of Our Hearts Curia gave their Quarterly Report. They reported that during the past three months their Curia has had informative discussions which included, "The Annunciation", "Life of Mary", and "Marian Tradition: The May Crowning".

BAY AREA CURIA

The Bay Area Curia was established in 1977, they have seven attached Praesidia. An election for Curia Secretary will be held at the August meeting. Annual Report **Our Lady Queen of Peace**, Queen of Peace Church. La Marque. This is their 2nd Annual Report. They have six Active Members and 15 Auxiliary Members. Their works include three nursing homes and home visits. One member worked at the Catholic Information Booth, Strawberry Fest with a member from another Praesidium. They are planning a retreat to the Christian Renewal Center in Dickinson in September.

Sr. Eilene gave a report on the Catholic Information Booth, Strawberry Fest in May. Distributed 725 Rosaries, 417 Miraculous Medals, 50 Brown Scapulars, 75 Pillar of Fire Booklets (English) and 50 in (Spanish), 269 How to Pray the Rosary pamphlets (English) and 50 in (Spanish) and 400 prayer cards in both English and Spanish. Many important encounters were made. A woman who got her Miraculous Medal at our booth 15 years ago still wears it. She clasps it when going through hard times. She said it gets her through her hardship. **OL of Fatima Praesidium**, St. Mary of the Expectation Church, League City gave their 6th Annual Report. They have 11 Active Members, 5 on probation, 167 Auxiliary Members, 5 Adjuvorian, Deacon Russ Carroll is their Spiritual Director. Regular works done in pairs include: PVS home visitations, Faith Formation, nursing home visitations, homebound and hospital visitations, welcome New members and Children's Rosary on the first Saturday of the month. Future works include a book barrow at Hobby Airport, restart visiting and welcoming the newly baptized and an E-Day is scheduled for September 15th.

A report on the Jr. Praesidium at St. Paul the Apostle Church was given by Sr. Debbie. They have been meeting for 5 weeks. Membership presently is 5 to 6. They are making Rosaries, visiting nursing homes with senior Legionaries, cleaning holy water fonts and tidying church pews. They have chosen **Our Lady of the Northern Star** as their name.

SPANISH COMITIUM

Nuestra Señora Reina Y Madre

In May we participated in the Mass Crowning of our Blessed Mother at the Co-Cathedral sponsored by the Senatus.

Enthronements: During this period, our Comitium had 113, Curia Inmaculado Corazon de Maria 25, Curia Reina del Santisimo Rosario 62, Curia Nuestra Senora de la Asuncion 47, Curia Reina de la Paz 61, Curia Madre del Salvador 19, with a grand total of 327 enthronements. Door -to -Door: our Comitium had 773, Curia Inmaculado Corazon de Maria had 118, Curia Reina del Santisimo Rosario 195, Curia Nuestra Senora de la Asuncion 282, Curia Reina de la Paz 1,254, Curia Madre del Salvador 25. This is a grand total of 2,647 of door-to-door in the past 3 months. Auxiliary Members: our Comitium had 47, Curia Inmaculado Corazon de Maria 27, Curia Reina del Santisimo Rosario 5, Curia Nuestra Sefrora de la Asuncion 30, Curia Reina de la Paz, Curia Madre del Salvador 8, This is a grand total of 194 new auxiliary members.

COMITUM PRAESIDIA ANNUAL REPORTS: For this period, we report 2 adult Praesidia, 1 junior Praesidia, and 5 Curia. Praesidium Rosa Mistica (St. Rose of Lima Church, Houston, TX) has 8 Active Members and 20 Auxiliaries. They had 29 Enthronements, 33 Rosaries at home with the Pilgrim Virgin, 7 Rosaries at funerals, and 16 Door-to-Door. Praesidium-Puerta del Cielo (All Saints Church, Houston, TX) has 10 Active Members and 3 Auxiliaries. They had 38 Enthronements. They have 4 Virgin Statues and visited 65 homes. They prayed 8 Rosaries in wakes, visited the sick and the elderly 12 times, had 5 street contacts, and 3 extension days. 3.3 Junior Praesidium Madre Inmaculada (St. Ann Elizabeth Seton, Houston, TX) has 5 Active Members.

QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE CURIA - INMACULADO CORAZON DE MARIA":

Reports: Sr. Carolina H, president of the Curia, reported 2 adult Praesidia. **Praesidium Nuestra Sefrora del Rosario** (San Juan Diego, Pasadena, TX) has 7 Active Members and 8 Auxiliaries. They have 2 Pilgrim Virgin statues that visited 30 homes and had 29 Enthronements. They visited the sick 26 times and went to different nursing homes 27 times. They brought Communion to the sick 70 times. They said 3 Rosaries at wakes and had 17 street contacts.

Praesidium Reina del Monte Carmelo (Corpus Christi Church, Texas) has 15 Active Members, 1 on probation, and 29 Auxiliaries. They have 3 Pilgrim Virgin statues, visited 82 homes, and had 33 Enthronements. They had 236 Door-to-Doors. They visited the sick 61 times in nursing homes, hospitals and private homes. They brought Communion to the sick 34 times, They prayed the Rosary in 14 wakes and funerals. They had 34 street contacts and taught an adult catechism class.

The Curia is going to support for 3 months a praesidia that has only 4 members. They plan to have a recruitment and formation of new members.

QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE CURIA "NUESTRA SENORA DE LA ASUNCION":

Reports: President Br. Juan A reported 3 adult Praesidia.

Praesidium Nuestra Senora de Guadalupe (Nuestra Senora del Perpetua Socorro, Sweeny, TX) has 8 Active Members, 2 on probation, and 24 Auxiliaries. They have 4 Pilgrim Virgin statues. They have had 4 Enthronements, 52 home visits with the Pilgrim Virgin, and prayed 1 Rosary at a funeral. They had 23 Door-to-Door. They visited the sick 74 times and brought Communion to 156 persons. They had 40 street contacts. **Praesidium Arca de la Nueva Alianza** (St. Paul the Apostle, Nassau Bay, TX) has 9 Active Members, 137 Auxiliaries, and 4 Pretorians. They have 5 Pilgrim Virgin Statues and visited 80 homes. They had 9 Enthronements, prayed the Rosary at 6 wakes. Praesidium Templo y Sagrario de la Santisima Trinidad (Most Holy Trinity Church, Angleton, TX) has 9 Active Members, 128 Auxiliaries, and 1 on Probation. They have 3 Pilgrim Virgin Statues and visited 47 homes. They had 12 Enthronements and brought the Eucharist 498 times to different places. They had 252 Door-to-Door. They prayed the Rosary at 2 wakes. They visited the sick 71 times. They had a recruitment drive.

The Curia has been visiting two Praesidia per month to encourage them to continue their work. They will be supporting their new Praesidia in Manvel.

QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE CURIA "REINA DEL SANTISIMO ROSARIO.

Reports: President Br. Victor F reported 4 adult praesidia:

Praesidium Causa de Nuestra Alegria (San Carlos Borromeo Church, Houston TX) has 6 Active Members and 16 Auxiliary Members.

They visited 14 homes with the Pilgrim Virgin statue and had 8 Enthronements. They visited the sick at home and in hospitals. They prayed the Rosary at 2 wakes. Praesidium Reina de las Familias (San Martin de Porres, Crosby, TX) has 12 Active Members, and 18 Auxiliaries. They had 17 Enthronements and 26 home visits. They had 115 Door-to-Door. They visit the elderly and the sick in their homes. They have a book barrow. They supported the Curia. **Nuestra Senora de los Dolores** (St. Charles Borromeo Church, Houston, TX) They have 5 Active Members, 1 on probation, and 22 Auxiliaries. They visited 20 homes with the Pilgrim Virgin and had 16 Enthronements. They had 35 Door-to-Door. They visit the elderly and the sick in their homes. **Nuestra Senora de la Asuncion** (Our Lady of the Assumption Church, Houston, TX) They have 10 Active Members, and 40 Auxiliaries. They visited 79 homes with the Pilgrim Virgin and had 34 Enthronements. They had 80 Door-to-Door. They visited 37 times the elderly and the sick in their homes bringing them Holy Communion. They have a book barrow and participated in 2 wakes praying the Rosary.

Their future plans are to have different recruitments to fill in some vacancies.

QUARTERLY REPORT FOR THE CURIA "REINA DE LA PAZ"

Reports: President Heidi Banegas reported 2 adult Praesidia, 1 junior Praesidia, and 1 group of children: **Praesidium Madre del Buen Consejo** (St. Justin Martyr, Houston, TX) has 3 Active Members, 2 on probation, 15 Auxiliaries. They have 2 Pilgrim Virgin. They had 22 Enthronements. They visit the elderly, the sick in hospitals, and the jail. They support the recruitment team. They teach the Rosary to families that bring children to Church for their Baptism. **Junior Praesidium Reina de la Paz** (St. Thomas More, Houston, TX) has 10 Active Members and 11 Auxiliaries, 5 of them are altar servers and 4 of them help with catechism. They go to the Blessed Sacrament for one hour once a month. On Sundays, they pray the Rosary before and after mass. They visit the elderly. Their future plans are to visit children in hospitals and to continue giving away religious materials. **Praesidium Madre de las Naciones** (St. Albert Trapani, Houston, TX) has 4 Active Members, 2 on probation, and 75 Auxiliaries. They have 3 Pilgrim Virgin statues and visited 26 homes. They had 24 Enthronements. They had 252 door-to-door. They visited the sick, had the book barrow twice, and gave support with one Praesidia. Children's group Granitos de Maria (St. Thomas More, Houston, TX) has 8 children. They have learned how to say the prayers of our meetings. They are learning how to say the Catena. They give away medals and holy cards to their friends and family members. They have called sick family

members or friends. They say the Rosary once a month before Mass.

QUARTERLY REPORT FROM CURIA'MADRE DEL SALVADOR Reports: President Laura H reported 2 adult Praesidia: **Praesidium Rosa Mistica** (St. Mary Magdalen, Humble, TX) has 16 Active Members, 3 are on probation, and 58 Auxiliaries. They had 11 Enthronements, 29 home visits, 22 visits to the sick, 214 visits to a nursing home, 73 visits to the jail. They prayed 4 Rosaries at wakes. They distributed the Holy Eucharist to the sick. **Praesidium Puerta del Cielo** (San Juan de la Cruz, New Caney, TX) has 4 Active Members, 2 on probation, and 4 Auxiliary Members. They had 7 Enthronements. They visited 37 homes with the Pilgrim Virgin statue. They had 28 Door-to-Door. They are transitioning one Praesidium in Huntsville in Spanish as members of the Curia. They are finalizing the opening of a second Praesidium in St. Mary Magdalen Church in Humble. Future Plans and Projects of the Comitium are: officers workshop August 25th, St. Jerome Catholic Church.
