Our Lady of Divine Providence

Toward the end of his term as bishop of San Juan, Puerto Rico, Gil Esteve y Tomás ordered a statue of Our Lady of Divine Providence from a sculptor in Barcelona, Spain, where he had served as vicar before being ordained bishop. On January 2, 1853, the image was installed in the cathedral, and for many years Puerto Ricans celebrated the feast of the Mother of Divine Providence on January 2. The statue was canonically crowned November 19, 1950. When Pope Paul VI proclaimed her patron of the island in 1970, he moved her local feast to November 19 to coincide with Puerto Rican Discovery Day. San Juan's beloved image bears only a vague resemblance to that of the Mother of Divine Providence that spread from Rome around the world after 1752. The Roman work is a painting which depicts a half-length Madonna in her traditional red robe gazing down at the child she holds against her breast. He looks up at her, holding her left hand in his. The full-figure statue in San Juan shows Mary holding her son's left hand in both of hers while he reclines on her ivory-robed lap (photo by Miguel E. Gallardo).

Suggestions as to Works

(e) Sodalties for the young.

For children who have been at good schools, the crisis comes at school-leaving age. They are then emancipated from school with its sound influences, its protective restraints, its minute safeguards. Sometimes they were entirely dependent upon that support by reason of the fact that their homes did not provide religious or controlling influences. There is the further complication that the withdrawal of these things occurs about the age of greatest moral difficulty, and unfortunately, too, when those young people have ceased to be children without becoming adults. Naturally, appropriate provision for that twilight stage is difficult, and accordingly is frequently lacking. Then, when that transition period passes, and the adult safeguarding system opens its arms to them, it usually does so unavailingly. The perilous charms of liberty have been tasted. Therefore, the supervision which was maintained in school must in some measure be carried on when those children leave. A method which is recommended is that of forming, under the auspices of the Legion, Juvenile Sodalties, or at least special juvenile sections in the ordinary Sodalties. Before the children are due to leave school, those in authority will see that the names of such children are supplied to the legionaries. The latter will then call to their homes to make their acquaintance and to persuade them to join the Sodality. The children, who cannot be induced to join, should be made the subject of special visitation, as also those who attend irregularly. Each legionary would be allocated a certain number of the young Sodality members, for whom he or she will be held responsible. Before each Sodality meeting, those members will be called upon to remind them of their duty to attend. An Annual Retreat (enclosed, if possible) and an annual entertainment should form part of the system. There is no better way, in fact there is no other definite way, of ensuring a regular frequentation of the Sacraments by the young during the post-school period. The case of young people discharged from Juvenile Detention Centers or Orphanages requires special attention in the above direction. Sometimes they are without parents altogether; sometimes they are the victims of bad parents.

ALLOCUTIO**By Fr. Victor Perez****Spiritual Director of the Houston Senatus**

The young. The young have so many temptations today. As the handbook states kids leave school and often leave the sacraments. We can say they leave their parents' house and they stop going to Mass. How are we going to help our youth? Is praying for them enough? Are we teaching children the Holy Rosary? Do we ever approach our youth ministers and ask them if they ever pray the rosary with the teens, with the children? Where are the sodalities of today? Have we stopped giving our children to Mary? Have we stopped inspiring in them a feeling of piety and tenderness to the Virgin Mary?

We all know that Mary appeared to the young people. She appeared to Bernadette, to Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta. What does it look like a sodality for the young? Another work of the Legion is teaching Catechesis. We are to teach the children as if Mary were teaching them. We should see the children the way Mary would see them. The Legion also encourages us to ask about the parents about their children to help the children get into CCE and to get their sacraments. It is beautiful to see in some neighborhoods people are teaching catechesis in people's homes.

When Legionaries do home enthronements of the Sacred Heart or pray the rosary with the family this leaves a profound impression. The more we can get kids to pray the rosary the better. Of course, they should be encouraged and not forced. We have to place spiritual armor on our children, the Scapular and devotion to Mary. We as Legionaries are instruments of Mary. We place in her hands our lives. Do we not realize that she will use us? Are we open to the Spirit's prompting? What is Mary calling us to do? Are we conscious of being her instrument every day, offering ourselves to her completely every morning? Are we recruiting for the Legion? Are we open to doing more works, working with our pastors? Or are we always doing the same works? We should never abandon the works we do, but we can easily get into a routine. If we recruit more perhaps it will open up to more works, even works for the youth. What is the Holy Spirit calling us to do? Is there anyone who can form a youth presidium? How many kids would love to have a motherly or fatherly figure to help them to pray the rosary. Obviously, legionaries always must be with children only with other adults and going through the parents. We have to begin with them in elementary school, when they are open. Mary will form in them a Spirit of devotion and reverence and love for Jesus and the sacraments. Our youth have a battle, a lot of temptation. We should pray our rosary for them. God will raise up the greatest saints from them.

Each Comitium meeting is enriched with readings from the bulletins of the Concilium and Senatus, and also the Legion causes.

Our Lady of the Rosary praesidium gave their 35th annual report: They have 14 active members, 3 praetorian, 138 auxiliaries and 5 adjutorians. Result with 8 new auxiliary members and 2932 hours of Legion works.

Our Lady of Sorrow praesidium their 22nd annual report: They have 9 active members, 1 praetorian, 56 auxiliaries and 5 adjutorians. Result with 4 new auxiliary members and 1651 hours of Legion works. The Praesidium has helped a man receive the sacrament of Reconciliation after 20 years away from God. **Presentation of The Lord** praesidium gave their seventh annual report. They have 9 active members, 37 auxiliaries and 1 adjutorian. Result with 2 new auxiliary member, 704.5 hours of Legion works. Together with the Spiritual Director, praesidium helped a Protestant, join the Catholic Church. The brothers and sisters in Praesidium are also helping a Protestants who live in the nursing home to find and love the Rosary. With all of their enthusiasms, praesidium have lifted the spirit of a young Vietnamese man who was released from prison. The works of these Praesidia consist of making home visits to Catholics and non-Catholics, visiting patients in the hospitals, nursing home and their homes, Visiting Active and Auxiliary members; Fatima Pilgrim Status; Visiting and praying for the mourning families at wakes and funerals; Taking communion to the sick, the homebound and the shut-ins.

HOUSTON LOCAL COUNCILS**VIETNAMESE CURIA****Mary, Mother of the Church**

Three Praesidia gave their reports during this period.

Our Lady of Perpetual Help praesidium gave their Fourth annual report. They currently have 16 active members (1 in probation), 1 praetorian, 100 auxiliaries and 4 adjutorians. Resulting with 2,736 hours of Legion works and 15 new auxiliaries. After many days of meeting, exhorting, and praying, thanks to the persistence of the Legion brothers and sisters has brought a Catholic patient whom was many years away from God to receive confession and communion before passing away peacefully four months later.

Our Lady, Mediatrix of All Graces praesidium gave their 33rd annual report. They have 20 active members (1 in probation), 1 praetorian, 100 auxiliaries and 11 adjutorians. Resulting with 2521 hours of Legion works. Praesidium has helped a man receive the sacrament of Baptism. Helping a man 57 years away from God received the sacrament of reconciliation and marriage validation. Giving catechesis to a couple and both received the sacrament of Baptism. They lead a Holy Eucharist hour at their parish church every weekday.

Our Lady of the Faithful praesidium gave their 27th annual report. They have 12 active members, 55 auxiliaries and 10 adjutorians. Resulting with 1047 hours of Legion works and four new active members. Their future plan is to work on recruiting new members. The works of these Praesidia consist of Fatima Pilgrim Status, leading Holy Eucharist hours, visiting patients in their homes, hospitals and nursing homes, taking communion to the sick, the homebound and the shut-ins, visiting and praying for the mourning families at wakes and funerals, helping with adult CCE class, visiting auxiliary families, Catholic and non-Catholic families and the newly baptized members in their parish. We are planning for our Annual general reunion on December 8th at Our Lady of Lourdes church.

NORTHERN CURIA**Redemptoris Mater**

Our Curia was Affiliated in 2005. Our Spiritual Directors are Fr. Joseph Manapuram and Sr. Felice Mojica. We have 9 attached Praesidia. President's report: We had a meeting with the Fr. Innocent Okifor, Parochial Vicar, at Christ the Good Shepherd regarding extension. Currently, the plan is to have a table for Legion recruitment at all masses in the weekend of

October 27th/28th. Prior to this, in lieu of Legion of Mary promotion at Mass, an article regarding the Legion of Mary including the planned recruitment exercise will be published in the parish bulletin for about two (2) weeks ahead of the recruitment weekend. The current working plan is to setup legion table with the Spanish praesidium at the parish fellowship Sunday. At this event, recruitment efforts will be undertaken. The Spanish praesidium is excited about the plan and have promised to help us along the way. We are holding an Officers training to help in the development of our praesidia officers on Saturday 10th November, 2018. This

training will involve interaction and group discussion between officers. We are excited to have Senatus officers as facilitators of the various sections.

Our Prison Praesidium has seen a return of members (moved due to Hurricane Harvey). We assisted with a recruitment drive with Mary, Help of Christians. We heard annual reports by **Mother of Eucharist** and **Our Lady of the Sacred Heart**. **Mother of Eucharist** gave their 13th Annual Report. Their Spiritual Director is Rev. Fred Vallone. They have 5 active members and 73 Auxiliary members. They have 1 member on visiting from El Salvador. Active works include visitation to Creekside Healthcare facility and to the homebound parishioners. They instruct 2nd grade CCE. They instructed all CCE students in making and praying the Rosary and baptismal classes. They promote, instruct and lead the Rosary at funeral wakes, funerals or grave-side and PVS. They went door to door with good success. They made 548 personal contacts. They distributed 453 sacramentals and 340 pieces of literature in their parking lot ministry, at the Church annual Bazaar and during an Auxiliary member event.

Our Lady of the Sacred Heart gave their 19th Annual Report. Their Spiritual Director is Rev. Clair Orso. They have five active members four of which are Praetorians, two probationary members and 50 Auxiliary members.

Active works include visitation to several Health Care facilities to pray and distribute communion. They visit and bring Holy Communion to the homebound. They prayed for and gave communion over 2,000 times during the year. They lead a weekly broadcasted bilingual Chaplet of Divine Mercy and bilingual rosary at St. Luke's Hospital. They sang and prayed the Rosary with CCE students during a May Crowning event. They led the Rosary at 5 funerals. They distributed 907 sacramentals pieces of literature. They had a recruitment table with literature and sacramentals at their Church annual Bazaar. They brought Our lady to 4 homes (PVS). Recruitment of active and auxiliary members increase PVS and have a door to door visitation are part of their future plans.

NORTH EAST CURIA**Our Lady of Perpetual Help**

The Northeast Curia consists of six praesidia, and two Jr. praesidia. We meet on the third Sunday of each month at 2pm, and we have all of our officer positions filled. We have had good attendance during this past quarter. A highlight for this period, our Curia hosted our first Day of Prayer and Reflection

on September 9, 2018, that was the birthday of the Blessed Virgin. We were able to recite the Rosary, attend Mass, enjoy a wonderful presentation by Fr. Rodolfo Cal-Ortiz. After lunch, we took part in a Benediction service. It was a very nice celebration, to stop and enjoy the peace and joy of knowing the Blessed Mother. There was about 25 people in attendance. During this period, we received a report from **Mary, Help of Christians praesidium**, from St. Andrew Catholic Church in Channelview, TX. This was their 10th annual report, and this praesidium meets every Tuesday at 9:15am with 5 active members, one member just made her promise, and another one

on probation. There are 25 auxiliary members, they are in the process of updating the list of auxiliary members. Their Spiritual Director is Fr. Christopher Shackelford, the pastor of St. Andrew Catholic Church. We will have a Legion of Mary booth at the Parish Bazaar to distribute pamphlets, rosaries, to promote the Jr. and Sr. Legion, and the Pilgrim statue visitation. They have participated in the Acies celebration, the May Crowning in the Parish and at the Senatus and bring Holy Communion to some of the homebound parishioners. They also participated in the Ministry Fair in the Parish, on August 26, where rosaries and pamphlets were given out and families were encouraged to pray as a family.

This praesidium also held its first "book barrow" on August 4, 2018, where rosaries, prayer books, and prayer cards were given out. About 20 contacts were made with children and adults to encourage them to get their children baptized, attend Mass more regularly and praying the rosary with their families. Two important things took place here: One mother said she was surprised and excited to see the rosary because her mother had taught her children to say the rosary, and the grandmother had since passed away, so the children were left in limbo. She was happy that she could bring the rosaries and pamphlets home to the children and start praying the rosary again, in honor of their grandmother. The mother was not Catholic, but she was encouraged to pray the Rosary with her children. One teen boy about 14 years old, looked at some of the books we had to give away, and he decided on "Rediscovering Jesus"! He said that he needed something to read to finish out his summer break. He had made his baptism and First Communion, but somewhere in the turmoil of life his mother had stopped taking the children to Mass and religious education.

SOUTH WEST CURIA

Our Lady of the Sacred Heart

We appreciate the continued support from our Spiritual Director, Deacon Ernie Abadejos . Our S.W. Curia has 17 Praesidia, six were visited by S.W. Curia Officers during this quarter: two in July two in August and two in September. One Praesidium has its new slate of Officers soon to be appointed to the Council. We had four Praesidia with perfect attendance, as well as, perfect attendance for the five Curia Officers. Ple Four Annual reports were given. Mother of Divine Grace (St. Benedict de Abbot Church) gave their 24th Annual Report. The praesidium's 3 active members go on Fridays and Saturdays to visit Nursing Homes and Homebound parishioners. Their Pastor, Fr. Clement, depends on them.

Sis. Leah commended the members on a productive presentation: saying that it makes a lot of sense that, so few are able to do so much as compared to the 12 Apostles. So, few can do heroic work which should encourage all members.

Queen of the Holy Family (Holy Family Church) gave their 18th Annual Report. Members transferred the Pilgrim Virgin Statue to 16 homes and prayed the Rosary with family and guests. Members organized 4 home Enthronements, teaches CCE, and are RCIA sponsors. Holy Family Church hosts the All-Night Vigil in October. They are in the process of updating their list of 138 auxiliary. At their Parish Ministry

Sunday 9 people signed up to join the Legion of Mary. **Mary, Cause of Our Joy** (St. Thomas Aquinas Church) gave their 12th Annual Report. They have 17 Active Members and their Parish Priest as their Spiritual Director. Pilgrim Virgin Statue was transferred to 28 homes, distributed Holy Communion to 185 homebound parishioners, coordinated the weekly Novena Mass to Our Mother of Perpetual Help with 125 to 150 attendees, participated in a Sunday Communion Service to 742 residents at an Assisted Living Facility. **Mother of the Incarnate Word** (Holy Family Church) gave their 18th Annual Report. A tribute was made in the form of a moment of silence for their former Vice President Dianne Lewis, Deceased on August 8, 2018. Their Active works include: transferring the Pilgrim Virgin Statue from one home to another every 2 weeks; Coordinate the recitation of the Rosary and the Divine Merry Chaplet after daily Mass with about 25 parishioners; visit two Nursing Homes weekly; co-host the All-Night Vigil in October. Their Junior Praesidium makes Rosaries to distribute at parish events.

An election of S.W. Curia Officers for President and Secretary was conducted . Both officers were ratified at the September Senatus Meeting. A retreat is planned to be held at St. Vincent de Paul Church. The S.W. Curia Acies will be held at St. Laurence Church March 16th, 2019.

SOUTHERN COMITIUM

All Praesidia in our Comitium were encouraged to have a Praesidium function to celebrate the Blessed Mother's birthday. A new Secretary was appointed to Our Lady of the Rosary, Jr. Praesidium in Manvel, TX. **Immaculate Heart of Mary** Praesidium gave their annual report. They have four members and thirty auxiliaries. They visit the sick, bring Holy Communion, recite the rosary with the sick, and work with the junior Praesidium. They celebrated their Praesidium function honoring the Blessed Mother and invited thirty people to come and see what the Legion of Mary is all about. Two people came to the Praesidium meeting.

Mary Star of the Sea praesidium gave their annual report. They visit the home bound and nursing homes.

Bay City Curia: They have four Praesidia. Two Praesidium's in Bay City, one in Palacios, and one in Victoria. The Vietnamese Praesidium in Palacios has started a Junior Praesidium with seventeen members. The works of the Curia include home visits, leading rosary at funerals, pilgrim virgin visits, and bring Holy Communion to the home bound.

September: **Mystical Rose** prison Praesidium gave their nineteenth annual report. Brother James S. has been helping

them since their beginning in September 29, 1999. They have fifteen to eighteen active members. They currently average ten guests per meeting. Three priests, Father Victor Perez, Father Mike Carmody, and Father Frank Wittouck visit the prison each month for confessions and Mass. In addition, Deacon Garza provides the men Adoration on the first Friday's and provide Communion service on the second Saturday of each month. Deacon Melendez provides a bilingual Communion service on the fourth Saturday of the month. Mystical Rose was the first Praesidium in a prison in America. Now there are several in the 104 prison's in Texas. Daniel Cardinal DiNardo

confirmed six men joining the faith this past year. Sister San Juanita also worked with them for two years. She has now moved to the Mexican prison in San Diego. The Legion continues to evangelize to many faith groups each day in our cell blocks, at our jobs, and even on the recreations yard. Many try to get their families to come back to the faith. From donations we provide spiritual materials on our library cart. The books are read and returned to the cart. We have weathered many changes, but we are emerging stronger and filled with the Holy Spirit guided by Divine Grace to serve with your support to help the neglected, the abused, and the forgotten inside these prison walls. We keep the Comitium, Curia, and Senatus in our daily prayers, rosary at Mass, and in our hearts.

LOCAL ATTACHED PRAESIDIA


