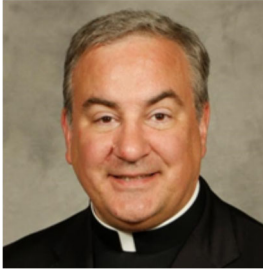

**EVENING PRAYER FOR ST. LUKE**

The liturgical life of the Church includes Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer. These periods of prayer consist of a hymn, several psalms, scripture, a canticle, intercessions and the Lord's Prayer. Our parish choir, under the direction of Alex Fries, will sing Evening Prayer on Thursday October 18, the Feast of St. Luke the Evangelist. Given that we have thirty people in our Bible Study learning about the Gospel of Luke, I think this is a fitting way for us to gather with the wider parish and thank God for St. Luke, who composed one of the four gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. Evening Prayer will begin at 7:00pm.

There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at 6:00 pm and Benediction will take place at 7:40, at the conclusion of Evening Prayer. Confession will be available from 6-7:00 pm.
