

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Each year's Christmas Season offers a different focus for our meditation. The depth of the mystery of the Incarnation presents us with many opportunities for reflection. Wherever we find ourselves in any given year. especially in our spiritual lives, informs our reflection. This year I have found myself intrigued by the truth that God decided that 1st century Palestine was the "fullness of time." Why then? Why there? There is no doubt that Mary played a role in the divine decision. Indeed, a substantial role. Perhaps, the only role. This question is not unimportant, but it is a bit esoteric. Since the first Christmas, every time and every place is able to experience the fullness of God's presence in Jesus Christ. The important question now is how? How can I, in this time and place, experience more fully and enter more deeply into the very presence of God made real in Jesus Christ. This is the journey that all of us – and all people of every time and place – must undertake.

Today's Solemnity of the Epiphany offers us guidance in this undertaking. The Magi are presented as models for our own personal and communal journeys. Astrologers are not given any credence in Christianity, of course, but Monika Hellwig – a great Scripture scholar – reflects:

Yet, what better way is there to represent the task of reading the signs of the times, than by the star-gazers who follow their inspiration and vision until they truly find Christ, acknowledging his rule of peace by their gold, his mystery by their frankincense, and his tragic role in our troubled history by their myrrh. Their presence in the Gospels is a little like that of Melchisedech in the story of Abraham; they come mysteriously with wisdom and gifts, to seek one greater than themselves, and they disappear again without a trace. But they are symbols of hope, representing the unexpectedness, the gratuitous character, the wonder of God's glory breaking through the darkness of the nations. They come from afar, from nations outside the covenant of Israel. They are unexpected, expressing the vearning of all peoples for a better world, a better life. community with one another, and communion with God.

The Good News is that despite the darkness which covers the earth today, God offers us signs and points us in the right direction. Our journey, like theirs, is long and arduous, it takes unexpected turns and crosses rough roads. And like theirs, brings us to the Light of the World.
