

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is also known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" because each year the gospel passage is taken from the 10th chapter of John's Gospel. This chapter presents varied reflections about Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Here at St. John's this year it also "First Communion Sunday." At the 10:15 a.m. Mass on Sunday thirty-eight of our children will receive the Eucharist for the first time. It is a most fitting day for this important celebration.

Monika Hellwig offers a wonderful reflection on the Good Shepherd: "The image of the shepherd has a long history in Israel. God has been imagined as the shepherd of Israel (Ps. 23), David, Israel's best loved King, came to the throne from a youth spent as a shepherd. Jesus himself was fond of the image and used it for God in one of his most striking parables about forgiveness in Luke 15. The image seems to be used because the shepherd leads the flock into safe pathways, to places of nourishment, protecting it against attack, providing the focus which unites the flock and gives it a sense of direction and purpose. Beyond all this, the shepherd is a symbol of compassion, in the root sense of that word, for the shepherd fulfills all those tasks by entering into the life and the experience of the flock, sharing its risks and hardships, becoming responsible for its fate."

It is in the Eucharist that we experience the real presence of the Good Shepherd in the fullest way. Jesus willingly goes even to his death for our sins. Still, he does not abandon us but through the Spirit remains our Shepherd. Congratulations to the children who receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time this Sunday. The celebration reminds all of us of the gift of the Eucharist. My thanks to Donna Mastrovito who always does an exemplary job in preparing the students. This year (with 38 of them!) we owe her some special thanks! Thanks, as well, to Carole Cronin and Sue Basiul for their expert assistance and to Sisters Mary, Carol and Janet for organizing the reception which follows the Mass.

In more mundane, if necessary matters – before the winter we had contracted with a roofer to repair the two side roofs of the church. As we all know so well, it was a difficult winter and there were numerous shingles which blew off the upper roof. Therefore, we are having it replaced, as well. The total cost will be around \$60,000. Quite a bit of money. We will be using our savings to pay for the work. I am, always, most grateful for your long standing and continual generosity to St. John's.
