**Billing information:** Elementary students are billed at the beginning of each month and reflects any past unpaid charges along with needed Lunch payment for the month. If student has permission to purchase extras please make manager aware of your approval. Account is setup by parent using child's birthday.

**Free and Reduced Price Meal Applications** are provided each year and must be completed at the beginning of each school year, unless you receive a letter from FNS informing parent of approved status.
