

From the Pastor's Desk...

The Open Secrets of Christ's Becoming Man: Salvation and Unity

One of the most profound passages in the Gospels is Matthew's 1:1-17. We struggle through hearing the Lector read forty-two generations of ancient Jewish names, from Abraham to Jesus. Why? Saint Augustine provides a reason in clear but human terms when he



says, "Christ rose *in the flesh* in order to ensure we could believe in our resurrection *of the flesh* [and the need for our unity with him]." Christ won trust by the resurrection of His flesh.

People who help or minister to others who are struggling find that they are so much more effective when they have lived the same struggles or experiences previously. Could you love your children or friends if you did not see them and their smile? Could you really relate to someone who never got tired or rested, never slept or was never hungry or thirsty? How about someone who was never wrong nor felt unfairly treated or embarrassed?

In this regard, it is so practical for the Son of God to take on flesh like one with us. God might be less real for us if we could not imagine his sharing our humanity. We can't relate simply to some type of "spirit in the sky." Along with the mind, heart and soul, we experience human feelings and virtues such as love, mercy, trust, compassion, understanding and forgiveness. We need hugs and hand-shakes and the ability to look into each other's eyes. So while going through the genealogy of Jesus is a challenge, it brings a sense of unity to the humanity - as well as the divinity - of Christ who became man to show how much we are loved and desired by the Father. Christ took on humanity so he could not only say, "I AM" but "I AM one of you."

In Mere Christianity, C. S. Lewis helps us to understand that God (Continued on Page 4)

Helping Hands 2016 — 50,000 Meals in less than 2 hours!



Following a wonderful evening of Team Trivia, 230 volunteers gathered in the Saint Monica parish center on Sunday, March 13th for the second annual *Helping Hands Meal Packing Event*. After the brief presentations from Maureen McCullough (Director of CRS NE), Pascasie Musabyemungu (Program Coordinator, Rwanda), and Dr. Duane Milne (our local PA State Representative), we got to work packing 50,000 meals in just under two hours. It was amazing to watch and blessing to be a part of!

How is it possible to pack 50,000 meals in less than two hours? The answer: a well-orchestrated system of funnels, weighing stations, sealers, and hardworking volunteers! At the start of the event, participants were asked to spread out around the gymnasium and find a station that they wanted to work at. Each funnel station had 5 volunteers who would funnel their assigned ingredient into a bag at the

center. Once enough bags were accumulated, runners would pick up the bags and take them to a weighing station. The contents were adjusted as needed then passed to a sealing station. Once sealed,



the bags were systematically boxed and loaded into an awaiting truck. In the coming weeks, our truckload will be merged with other truckloads to fill a shipping container which will be transported to CRS operations in the West African Country of Burkina Faso.

The programs are designed to break the long term cycle of poverty. Our meals serve to provide basic nutrition in the short term so that families can benefit from the longer term effects of poverty alleviation.

never meant us to be a purely spiritual creature. Lewis writes about the mysterious need for the uniting of our humanity with Christ's Divinity when he says, "When Christians say the Christ-life is in them, they do not mean simply something mental or moral. They mean that Christ is actually operating through them that we are His fingers and muscles, the cells of His body. It explains why this new life is spread not only by purely mental acts like belief, but by bodily acts like Baptism and Holy Communion. It is not merely the spreading of an idea. That is why He uses material things like bread and wine to put the new life into us.

Some may think this rather crude and "unspiritual." God does not: He invented eating. He likes matter. He "invented" it. God also "invented" humanity. So, as we await the coming of Jesus' humanity, let us express our gratitude for our humanity. Consider the prayer of St, Ignatius Loyola, Anima Christi: "Take my body Jesus, eyes and ears and tongue. Never let them, Jesus, help to do thee wrong. Take my heart and fill it, full of love for thee. All I have I give thee, give thyself to me. Soul of Christ sanctify me. Body of Christ save me. Blood of Christ inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ wash me. Passion of Christ strengthen me. O good Jesus hear me. Within thy wounds hide me. At the hour of my death call me, and bid me come to thee. So that with all the Angels and Saints, I may praise thee forever and ever." By Deacon Bill Masapollo


