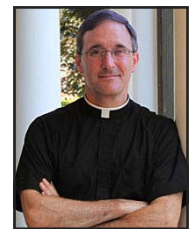

FROM the PASTOR'S DESK...



Why do we “do confession” the way that we do? Scott Hahn is a noted author, speaker, and Professor of Biblical Theology at The Franciscan University of Steubenville. He writes that there are actually three reasons, and all have to do with Jesus. Jesus was the one who gave us a clear plan of action to reestablish the rift between humans and God caused by sin:

1. Jesus insisted on Confession. (John 20:21-23)

2. He gave us something concrete to do - a liturgical act of sacrifice and penance - to make sure that we absolutely know that our sins are forgiven.

3. He insisted that we do this with the help and intercession of his priests.

Last week Cardinal Donald Wuerl and Swiss theologian Adrienne von Speyer provided some insights into people’s objections to Confession. Professor Hahn offers his ideas as well. *Is it healthy to think about sin and guilt and all of that stuff? One could ask, ‘Well, what are your alternatives? Counseling, medications, therapies, diversions and coping mechanisms?’ Now, understand, all of these have their place and can be beneficial. But none of them can address the heart of the matter - that our deepest wounds are caused by sin. As Augustine writes, ‘our hearts remain restless until they receive a divinely prescribed cure.’ Confession is the healthiest thing going. It provides - for our souls - what no doctor, dietician, physician, therapist and pharmacist could ever do. (And, compared to those other solutions, its cheap too.)*

Here’s a personal insight. I see parents in the area spending thousands of dollars on their kid’s sports programs. I know of one case where a young girl went to a field hockey conditioning coach on Monday, swam on Tuesday, had a field hockey personal trainer on Wednesday, swam on Thursday, had field hockey practice on Friday and then played field hockey games on Saturday and Sunday. Some of those games were outside of the State of Pennsylvania.

WHAT WE'RE SINGING

This weekend, the choir sings *Christ the Lord Is Risen Today* by well-known choral composer Philip W.J. Stopford. In recent years, members of our own Parish Choir attended choral workshops at the Cathedral in Philadelphia under the direction of Mr. Stopford. Born in 1977, Stopford is an English choral composer and choir director. He is known for his contemporary *a capella* and accompanied settings of traditional Latin and English prayers and hymns. Three of Stopford's works appeared in the Classic FM Hall of Fame 2014, after he made his first appearance on the chart in 2013.

Stopford began his musical career as a member of the choir of Westminster Abbey, and later graduated in music from Keble College, Oxford. He has composed numerous other works, including a Te Deum, a Latin Mass, and various Latin canticles. He formerly served as the choral director of Saint Anne Cathedral in Belfast, Northern Ireland. He is currently the director of the *Ecclesium* professional choir, which has released many CDs of Stopford's original works. As of 2016, Stopford works at Christ Church in Bronxville, New York.

Is that healthy? The September 4, 2017 cover featured article of Time Magazine was **“Crazy Travel, Crazy Costs, Crazy Stress. How Kid’s Sports Turned Pro.”** Time looked into this phenomenon where so much time, effort and money are spent on the body. What about the health of the soul? Some might think this overly dramatic, but someday each child will die. What happens then? All of that effort, all of that time invested, all of that money will count for nothing in terms of getting that child’s soul into heaven. We’re talking about, what, a 10-minute drive to church and an additional 10 minutes in the sacrament? Cost: free. Values: priceless.

And there are ancillary benefits as well. Hahn writes that nothing serves family life and workplace dynamic better than a clean soul and sound advice and encouragement from one of Christ’s priests. Cardinal Wuerl writes that one of the most enjoyable benefits of being an archbishop is traveling to, and attending, the many youth events held in his archdiocese and throughout the country. He has personally heard Confessions at such occasions as World Youth Day, Youth Rally for Life in Washington, and Steubenville Conferences. He finds the young people who attend such events to be enthusiastic, engaged, eager and interested - often at great sacrifice and cost. At vigils, many stay up all night in prayer. At the Rally for Life, young people travel long distances and stand for hours in cold, rain or snow.

In his book, *The Light Is ON for You*, Cardinal Wuerl writes, *One thing that I have noticed, is that these young people love what is distinctive about their Catholic faith. They love Mass. They love the uniqueness of Catholic devotions. They really enjoy spending time with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration. They love the commitment of the Church to social justice and human life. And they love Confession. Go to any youth event and look at the Confession stations. Hundreds go. They patiently wait in line. Look at their faces. They aren’t gloomy or sad or depressed or anxious. They’re smiling. They’re happy. They are happily chatting with friends in line beforehand and skipping with them arm in arm afterward back to the festival.*

Cardinal Wuerl’s experience. Confession at Kyros Retreats, World Youth Day and AbbyFest are some of my most enjoyable sacramental moments. I do not see one scintilla of evidence that these young people dread confession. They’re perky. They come over, plop into the chair with a “Yo faddah, howyadoin?” They celebrate the sacrament and then head back to their friends and start chatting and giggling away.
