Caring for Our Common Home ~ In his inaugural homily in 2013, Pope Francis called on us to embrace the vocation of being a "caretaker" It means "**caring for all of creation, the beauty of the created world ... caring for people, showing loving concern for each and every person.**" We have been inundated with the news of destruction and loss of life in the Caribbean, Mexico, and our southeastern states due to hurricanes, earthquakes and flooding. Our parish and diocese have joined generously in efforts to provide resources for our brothers and sisters in these places – and the need will continue for a very long time.

Awesome News! ~ The generosity of parishioners and the fundraising efforts of many have helped us meet our goal of

raising funds to build a well in Africa. The parish response has been so generous that we are 2/3 of the way for our second water project in that area. Work on the first well will begin in mid-October. You can follow this project to learn about the people in the Kivani Community in southeastern Kenya. The second fundraising will expand their ability to have clean and accessible water by participating with neighboring communities in the African Sand Dam Foundation.
