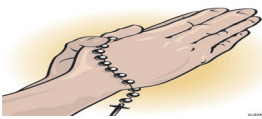

(Pope Francis) ~ Celebrate Fall with creativity, learning and respectful appreciation of God's gift of creation.

Go to your backyard or near-by park with the children or grandchildren:

- Bring a simple magnifying glass and look at the tiny creatures in your soil, examine leaves, flowers.
- Use bits of nature – bark, sticks, leaves, stones -to create works of art.
- Create a rock sculpture with stones you find
- Organize a nature scavenger hunt – Children can learn about creation as they search for pinecones, specific plant or tree leaves, acorns, stones of varied colors and sizes
- Start a "nature diary". Sketch a picture or take a photo of your yard now. Write about what you see. Check the same area next month. How has it changed? Capture the change in another sketch or photo. Repeat each month.
