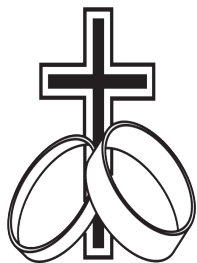
Pastor's Corner

Build A Bridge ~ Lent is an opportunity to build bridges and tear down walls that separate us. For forty days, we are called to assess personally and as a community how we are living as Christians, and to act through prayer, fasting and almsgiving to change the habits which divide us from one another, harm our world and estrange us from our God. To guide us on this journey of relationship-building and rebuilding, Catholic Relief Services (CSR) Rice Bowl (<https://www.crsricebowl.org>) suggests we look to the **Good Samaritan** who saw a person in need and acted, giving of his time, his assets; forging a relationship with a person he knew only as vulnerable. Further, he engaged another – the Inn Keeper – in this life-affirming act. This is how healing relationships are realized, how bridges between cultures are built, how communities of caregivers come into being. It is caring for God's creation...for the people of this earth and our universe.

And it can start with the simplest of acts...

Prayer...for the strength to change personal habits that harm us..

Fasting...maybe just giving up that plastic straw. (*Did you know that every day 500 million plastic straws are used in the United States? Many of these single use objects find their way into our oceans. By 2050 it is predicted that there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish.* <https://www.strawlessocean.org/>)

Almsgiving...donating the cost of the item you denied yourself to the CSR Rice Bowl and forging a relationship with people you know only as vulnerable.
