

## FROM FATHER MIKE


Pope Francis made a comment to priests early in his papacy that they should be “shepherds with the smell of sheep.” What he meant was that priests should actively know and be engaged in the daily life of the people in his parish. When Jesus proclaims in today’s gospel, “I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me,” he reminds us of his closeness to us and desire for the same from us. We can all know him better if all of us (not just priests) have the smell of sheep. Our church has a long tradition of encountering and knowing the Risen Lord by drawing close to those who are on the margins. For example, we can try making an effort to connect with those persons to whom others would not always talk or even notice. Just because someone makes us feel awkward because of their physical appearance, age, race, accent, special needs, or even smell does not mean they are any less in need of a kind gesture or warm greeting. Skin color, hair style, cultural differences, tattoos and piercings, hearing loss, memory problems, lack of English, or poor hygiene are some of many examples of aspects of a person that could either be an obstacle or opportunity for us to expand our idea of who is included as a sheep of the Good Shepherd. Think of how a smile, act of kindness, or word of encouragement could turn an encounter into a moment of real caring. While every interaction we have with others should have as its ultimate goal of bringing them more involved in our Catholic faith, even when this is not going to be realized, we can still be assured that through our engaging of others that they will have encountered Jesus, the one who is the Good Shepherd and truly interested in what is going on in the life of his sheep.
