

From Father Mike

First, a hearty welcome to our many visitors this Memorial Day weekend. As the Book of Revelation in today's second reading reminds us, the New Jerusalem, a vision of the church, is a city without a temple "for its temple is the Lord God almighty and the Lamb," How can the Lamb, the resurrected Jesus, be present in the church and not in a church building? John's gospel today states, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." Church buildings are important physical places for our faith, but if we are not sharing with others the presence of Christ, whose spirit dwells in us, then they become more like social centers than places of worship and spiritual nourishment. As we prepare for more information on the Uniting in Heart 2030 Pastoral Plan, I expect we will all have to grapple with a re-envisioning of ourselves as Catholics, invited to be witnesses of the gospel to others and not merely attendees at weekly Mass. Pope Francis, in his letter "The Joy of the Gospel," affirms that the "parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God's word, for growth in the Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. In all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers." I see the upcoming plan as a great chance to renew who we are as Catholics as an ongoing part of the New Jerusalem.

VICTIM ASSISTANCE MINISTRY-REPORTING AN INCIDENT

Who Should Make Reports:

- Victims of child sexual abuse by a person ministering on behalf of the Church
- Persons with a suspicion that a child may be sexually abused by a person ministering on behalf of the Church
- Persons concerned about violations about our Code of Conduct regarding appropriate behavior with children by any person ministering on behalf of the Church

How to Make a Report:

Indiana law requires any person who has reason to believe that a child is a victim of abuse or neglect must report immediately to:

- —The local Child Protection Services agency (Hotline: 800-800-5556); or
- —A local law enforcement agency. Under Indiana law, it is a criminal act not to make such a report. This law applies to all adults without exception.
