From the Pastor

Dear parishioners,

The third commandment is "Keep holy the Sabbath". From Apostolic times, Christians transferred the Sabbath observance of rest from the Mosaic ceremonial law to Sunday in commemoration of the Resurrection of Jesus on the first Easter. Certainly Jesus railed against an overly legalistic understanding of Sabbath rest that did not allow for one to do works of mercy on Saturday. Still, the presumption always was that Sabbath observance, rest from servile work throughout the entire day and attendance at synagogue, was still very much binding.

In the Tradition of the Church, Mass attendance, rest and prayer have always been the expectation for all Christians on Sunday, the day made holy by Christ's resurrection. There are instances where professional or family obligations will occasionally make it impossible to keep the Lord's Day holy, but these ought to be rare exceptions. On account of social trends, Catholics who are trying to live their faith have to struggle not to see Sunday as just another Saturday. When Sunday becomes just another Saturday, the Sunday obligation to attend Mass loses its deepest meaning, which is as the high point in a joyful day of restful celebration. Instead, one squeezes Mass into an otherwise busy day filled with social functions, sporting events and so on. In this environment of Sunday as another Saturday, one easily falls into the trap of congratulating oneself that one "made room for God" on Sunday before one got on to what one really wanted or needed to do.

Obviously there are many different angles from which to approach Sunday observance. We should never let the perfect become the enemy of the good. Most of us will do well if we are striving for constant improvement. But one thing that we should never forget is that it involves more than just attending Mass.
