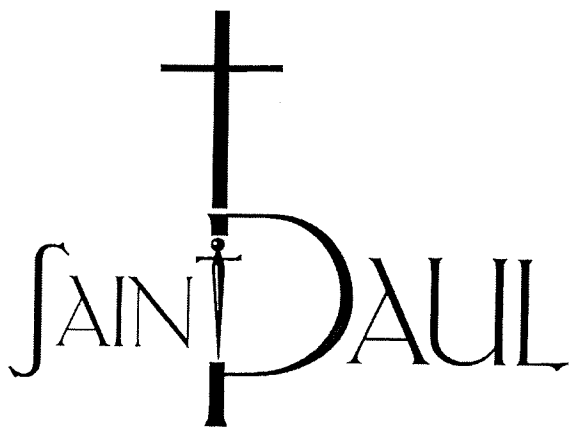

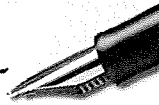
### Mission Statement

## From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

In 18th century France, atheism was beginning to become very popular, especially among the intellectual elite. One of the most prominent, if not the most prominent, French intellectuals at that time was Voltaire, a rabid atheist who hated the Church. Voltaire had a disciple who was raised in a devout Catholic home who wanted to leave his childhood faith behind and become a free thinker like his teacher. The problem was that no matter how hard he tried, he could not shake his childhood faith in the real presence of Jesus, body, blood soul and divinity in the Eucharist.

Voltaire's advice to his disciples was simple. He advised the young man to receive the Eucharist as often as possible. But rather than going to confession before receiving communion, as he had been taught, he should go out and commit as many mortal sins as possible. If the young man did these things, Voltaire explained, he would soon curse God, despise the Church and renounce his faith. The young man took Voltaire's advice and within four months he had become a convinced atheist and hated everything to do with religion. Rather than offer arguments claiming that the Catholic belief in the real presence was false or superstitious, Voltaire suggested sacrilegious reception of the Sacrament because he knew that sacrilege is a much shorter and more sure road to unbelief than argument.

Isn't this precisely the way it happens in the lives of so many who fall away from the faith? Very often those who leave the Church do not do so because they are convinced by arguments to switch religions or to stop believing in organized religion or in God; they do so because they have fallen into the habit of receiving Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin, without going to confession and unrepentant.

**EXPOSITION OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST**

Quoted from the Second Vatican Council's document on Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass published March 1975 ¶ 82, 86

"Exposition of the Holy Eucharist...in a mon-  
strance, leads us to acknowledge Christ's mar-  
velous presence in the sacraments and invites us  
to the spiritual union with Him that culminates in  
sacramental communion"

"It is recommended that solemn exposition of the  
Blessed Sacrament for an extended time should  
take place." "In this way the local community may  
meditate on this mystery more deeply and adore."  
"This kind of exposition, however may take place  
ONLY if there is assurance of the participation of  
a reasonable number of the faithful."

**SO—Adoration on first Fridays and first Satur-  
days will only happen with commitment of the  
faithful: there must be two names signed on the  
sign-up sheet for each hour or Adoration will be  
cancelled. The sign-up sheet is posted at the east  
doors of the church.**

About RCIA? There is no set time-period for completion of the Rite of  
Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) process, but rather four stages: Pre-  
catechumenate (inquiry); Catechumenate (dedicated formation), Purifica-  
tion and Enlightenment (coincides with Lent and the Easter Initiation Rites  
– baptism, confirmation and Eucharist); and Mystagogy (Easter to Pente-  
cost-for deepening of new faith).
