## From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

Several months ago, I introduced the pilgrimage that I am hoping to lead to England in August of 2019. There is a website that is now up with quite a bit of information: <http://www.pilgrimages.com/frroberts/>. This pilgrimage aims at helping one to familiarize oneself with the places in which great Christian writers in the English language lived and worked so as to grow closer to Jesus Christ. We will visit Cambridge University, where C.S. Lewis last taught before his death in 1963, as well as Birmingham, where Cardinal (Blessed) John Henry Newman spent more than half of his life and nearly his entire ministry as a Catholic priest. We will also stop at Stratford-upon-Avon, the birth and death place of the great playwright William Shakespeare. My hope is that we will have an occasion to look at selections of some of the writings of each of these three both in anticipation of and during our pilgrimage. Our most spiritually significant excursion will be to the ancient shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham, which has been a place of pilgrimage for around 1000 years. There will also be destinations of historical interest like Bath, London, Stonehenge and several Gothic cathedrals.

For those who have been blessed with resources necessary to take vacations outside the United States, a pilgrimage gives one the opportunity to take time away with Jesus in addition to taking in the historical and cultural riches of the country visited. In my own experience, these trips can be a once in a lifetime experience of spiritual transformation that continues to bear fruit for years. If you are able to, please consider joining me from August 1-9 in England.
