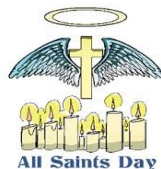

PLAN AHEAD: Wednesday, November 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation (ALL SAINTS). Mass schedule is as follows:

SA-M - Tues, Oct31, @7:30pm

SA-NT- Wed, Nov 1, @7:00am & 7:00pm

All Saints Day is a special feast day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. While most saints have a particular feast day on the Catholic calendar (usually, though not always, the date of their death), not all of those feast days are observed. And saints who have not been canonized—those who are in Heaven, but whose sainthood is known only to God—have no particular feast day.

WHAT IS ALL SOULS DAY: All Souls Day is observed on November 2 and is a day set aside for honoring the dead. The day is primarily celebrated in the Catholic Church and a few other denominations of Christianity. According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go.
