ANNULMENTS (Declarations of Nullity): The Tribunal of the Diocese of Bismarck assists Bishop David D. Kagan D.D., P.A., J.C.L., in his ministry to serve the people of our diocese. As a part of this ministry, the Office of Canonical Services is pleased to announce the implementation of an expanded service to this area. By way of video conferencing our tribunal staff is now available on a weekly basis to assist divorced Catholic and non-Catholic persons who may be seeking clarity and/or an explanation about the annulment process. GoToMeeting is a confidential and secure way to conduct online collaborative, face to face interviews and meetings between a tribunal auditor and anyone interested in the annulment process. An interview is recommended in order to begin the process. The purpose of the meeting would be to get a general overview of the basis for an annulment and to obtain the paperwork necessary to get the process started.

TWO NEW SAINTS: October 14 marks the official canonization of Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, who was martyred as he was celebrating Mass. Romero, El Salvador's first saint Romero was archbishop during a time of "great political crisis" in El Salvador and "outraged at seeing the violence against the weak and the killing of priests and catechists, felt the need to assume an attitude of fortitude." He was outspoken against his country's bloody civil war in the 1980s. He was gunned down during Mass in a hospital chapel March 24, 1980. His death is considered by the Catholic Church to have been in "odium fidei," meaning "in hatred of the faith."
Pope Paul VI Pope Paul VI, the pontiff who first appointed Romero a bishop and and in 1977 made him Archbishop of San Salvador will also be canonized. Pope Paul, who led the Church from 1963-1978, is largely remembered by his encyclical, Humanae Vitae, which delivered a strong "no" to change and reaffirmed the Church's teaching on birth control.
