Evangelization Committee

When the Synod began with listening sessions a few years ago, the biggest concern voiced by those in attendance was that our Catholic churches were not very warm, welcoming or friendly. This was not a criticism of any particular church parish, but an observation made of our Catholic churches in general. This gave rise to the first priority of the Synod to “Form Welcoming Communities”. In order to help foster warm, welcoming and friendly environments in our churches, the Archbishop has asked all parishes to form a group of “Ministers of Hospitality” (aka “greeters”). At St. Peter’s in Reserve we began this ministry on Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. Our biggest challenge is that we do not have enough people who have signed up to be greeters. Since we are once again asking for volunteers, we would like to clearly state what we are asking greeters to do. Here is our vision:

- Our greeters are covering the side doors – St. Mary’s Chapel (West Side) and St. Peter’s Chapel (East Side). Fr. John and Deacon Richard are covering the front doors.
- Our greeters are asked to be present by their assigned doors about 20 minutes before Mass begins.
- Greeters should open the door for those coming to Mass, and welcome them with a friendly smile and an appropriate greeting.
- Two greeters per door would be great. Husband and wife teams, or parent and child teams are welcome.
- Greeters do not have to distribute bulletins or other materials except on special occasions. They are to focus only on hospitality.
- Greeters move to their seats as the opening song begins. They are not asked to do anything during communion or after Mass.
- During extremely cold or hot weather, or in case of rain, greeters will move just inside of the doors.

We would like to have enough greeters not to schedule any given greeter more than once or twice a month. You are asked to prayerfully consider helping us by becoming a greeter. Social Justice Committee

The food box located in the front of the church has been filling up every 2 weeks. The collection in both St. Peter’s Church and St. Hubert’s Church has done so well we have decided not to have a dedicated food drive this spring. We are counting on the continued support of the parishioners to donate needed items for the June deliver. As of this date we are anticipating delivering food baskets and

food vouchers for perishable items on June 11. Your generosity has enabled us to deliver nearly 90 food baskets throughout the year.

The Social Justice Committee is continuing to meet with the Archdiocese leaders to develop other programs for Social Justice in our parish. Look for these in the near future.
