Cemetery Closure

The parish cemeteries need to be closed as cold weather descends upon us. As the weather gets colder it is difficult for the grave diggers to endure winds and weather working and the soil itself freezes and gets too hard to dig. Our insurance covers liability in our cemeteries until actual ice is on the ground so physical access for visits to graves remains allowed until snow falls. Those who enter the cemeteries during the winter are not covered by our insurance and we do not recommend it at all. **There will be no further burials in the cemeteries until spring.**

Confession Focus (to appear once in a while): Let us look at the old fashioned but very real sin of DETRACTION. This isn't a common word today and it is related to gossip. **Detraction is revealing something about another person that is true but is harmful to that person's reputation.** The Catechism of the Church calls it a part of the "offenses against the truth." Other sins against the truth are more common, such as, bearing false witness, perjury, calumny, boasting or lying. It is easy to see how these sins offend against the truth. They all are saying something that you either **know to be untrue or believe to be untrue.**

Detraction, however, is a special case. As the definition indicates, in order to be guilty of detraction, you have to say something that you either know to be true or believe to be true. How then is it a offense against truth? The answer lies in the **likely effects of detraction.** The Catechism of the Church (para. 2477) says: "Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury." If we talk about others, **even in truth,** and it offends the dignity of that person who is deserving of a good reputation, our **talk about them in the negative can have the effect of ruining their reputation.** Given the fact that all have the right to be forgiven and out of respect for our own sins being forgiven this "detraction" is sinful on our part and to be forgiven sacramentally in Confession. Think about it!
