First: there is plenty of room on the main floor of the church for those attending Mass and secondly, when others are in the choir loft the receiving of Holy Communion becomes an issue. For musicians in the choir loft I invite them to come to the main sanctuary following Mass and the Extraordinary Minister of that Mass or someone appointed by the clergy will give Holy Communion to you.

### Capital Campaign News

- An update of what has been pledged for the Capital Campaign so far:
  - Holy Angels: \$57,345.00 (52.41% of our goal) 24 donors
  - St. Ann's: \$101,247.00 (79.65% of our goal) 46 donors
  - St. Joseph's: \$12,565.00 (18.13% of our goal) 11 donors
  - St. Louis of France: \$1,010.00 (3.28% of our goal) 2 donors

### Announcement from the Diocese

This week, the Diocese of Ogdensburg released its report detailing the outcome of the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program or "IRCP". The IRCP is part of an on-going effort to express contrition to those who suffered sexual abuse by diocesan clergy and to help them find healing.

This report outlines the IRCP's progress, including the number of victims and accused abusers and compensation distributed. It also reviews the lessons learned in the process and summarizes our Save Environment program and how allegations of misconduct are handled today.
