**This week's Gospel Luke 6:27-38**

Just when you think you have this whole Christian thing figured out and believe that you're a 'good' person, the words of Jesus knock us back to the realization that we aren't there yet. Why can't we be just comfortable and ride this life out, not bothering anyone, just getting by?

The standard of 'love your neighbor' is not simply; not hurting her, not lying about him, not stealing his good name, rather it is willing the best for those most able to interrupt your complacency, blessing with prayer and caring actions that person who seems to get under your skin.

We claim to be Catholics, claim to be a part of something greater than ourselves so that we can get the benefit .....(fill in the blank). In truth, it isn't what we want, it's not our tidy plan for our life, our children, our spouse or friends or co-workers, It's about Him and Him alone that we're here and when we neglect that fact I cut off from myself the possibilities that far exceeds my limited, myopic vision of what the almighty made me for.
