**God's Words This Week**

Why do we hear so often that we are to "repent" of our sins? It is clear in this weekend's Gospel that God Himself is moved by the repentance of those who love Him.

Part of repentance is recognizing boundaries....that we as God's followers have crossed a boundary that is defined not by us but by God. Once having done so it is wise and beneficial to recognize this sin of violating something God has defined as sinful.

Repentance also helps us re-establish something that is right and good as defined by God. When something good has been tarnished by our opinions, actions, or even words repentance is the means by which we re-establish it as it ought to be. Marriage is tarnished by infidelity and repentance is good when the good of marriage has been violated. Sexual morality defines sex in it's proper context as good, limited to marriage, meant to bring new life in to the world... but when we reduce it to recreation only repentance of having done so re-establishes it to it's proper place.

Repentance keeps us honest and is always good when it is necessary. It is a very great sin to believe something sinful is no longer sinful because WE want to commit it.
