Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

One of the characteristics of the Catholic Church is the unity that exists between the Bishop of Rome (the Pope) and all other bishops; indeed, all those who call themselves Catholic. Seeking to know what the Pope teaches and to try to understand the vision and direction he brings to the Church Universal is a particular blessing of our faith. In view of that, it helps to hear what Pope Francis recently taught in his Easter message to the world:

“We Christians believe and know that Christ’s Resurrection is the true hope of the world, the hope that does not disappoint. It is the power of the grain of wheat, the power of that love which humbles itself and gives itself to the very end, and this truly renews the world. This power continues to bear fruit today in the furrows of our history, marked by so many acts of injustice and violence. It bears fruits of hope and dignity where there are deprivation and exclusion, hunger and unemployment, where there are migrants and refugees (so often rejected by today’s culture of waste), and victims of the drug trade, human trafficking and contemporary forms of slavery.

...This Easter, may the light of the risen Christ illumine the consciences of all political and military leaders, so that a swift end may be brought to the carnage in

course, that humanitarian law may be respected and that provisions be made to facilitate access to the aid so urgently needed by our brothers and sisters, while also ensuring fitting conditions for the return of the displaced ...May the risen Christ bring fruits of new life to those children, who as a result of wars and hunger, grow up without hope, lacking education and health care; and to those elderly persons who are cast off by a selfish culture that ostracizes those who are not ‘productive.’

We also implore fruits of wisdom for those who have political responsibilities in our world, that they may always respect human dignity, devote themselves actively to the pursuit of the common good, and ensure the development and security of their own citizens....Death, solitude and fear are not the last word. There is a word that only God can speak: it is the word of the resurrection. By the power of God’s love, it ‘dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord and brings down the mighty’ (see: The Easter Proclamation, The Exultet)!

How blessed we are to receive the gift of everlasting life from Our Risen Lord.

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

Una de las características de la Iglesia Católica es la unidad que existe entre el Obispo de Roma (el Papa) y todos los demás obispos; de hecho, todos los que se llaman a sí mismos católicos. Tratar de saber lo que el Papa enseña y tratar de comprender la visión y la dirección que aporta a la Iglesia Universal es una bendición particular de nuestra fe. En vista de eso, ayuda escuchar lo que el Papa Francisco enseñó recientemente en su mensaje de Pascua al mundo:

"Nosotros los cristianos creemos y sabemos que la Resurrección de Cristo es la verdadera esperanza del mundo, la esperanza que no defrauda. Es el poder del grano de trigo, el poder de ese amor que se humilla y se entrega hasta el final, y esto realmente renueva el mundo. Este poder continúa dando frutos hoy en los surcos de nuestra historia, marcado por tantos actos de injusticia y violencia. Da frutos de esperanza y dignidad donde hay privaciones y exclusiones, hambre y desempleo, donde hay migrantes y refugiados (tan a menudo rechazados por la cultura actual del despilfarro) y víctimas del narcotráfico, la trata de personas y las formas contemporáneas de esclavitud.

... Esta Pascua, que la luz del Cristo resucitado ilumine las conciencias de todos los líderes políticos y militares, para que se pueda poner fin rápidamente a la carnicería, que se respete el derecho humanitario y que se tomen medidas para facilitar la ayuda tan urgentemente necesaria para nuestros hermanos y hermanas, al tiempo que garantiza las condiciones adecuadas para el retorno de los desplazadosPuede que Cristo resucitado traiga frutos de vida nueva a aquellos niños que, como resultado de las guerras y el hambre, crecen sin esperanza , carente de educación y cuidado de la salud; y a esas personas mayores que son rechazadas por una cultura egoísta que excluye a aquellos que no son 'productivos'.

También imploramos frutos de sabiduría para quienes tienen responsabilidades políticas en nuestro mundo, para que siempre respeten la dignidad humana, se dediquen activamente a la búsqueda del bien común y garanticen el desarrollo y la seguridad de sus propios ciudadanos ... Muerte, soledad y el miedo no es la última palabra. Hay una palabra que solo Dios puede hablar: es la palabra de la resurrección. Por el poder del amor de Dios, 'disipa la maldad, lava las faltas, restaura la inocencia a los caídos y alegría a los dolientes, expulsa el odio, fomenta la concordia y derriba a los poderosos' (ver: La Proclamación de Pascua, El Exultet).

Cuán afortunados somos de recibir el regalo de la vida eterna de Nuestro Señor Resucitado.
