The wise will conserve their resources, use them prudently, and mark the passing of time. The foolish, on the other hand, not planning ahead, will be in the dark. Both of these readings tell us how accessible wisdom is to all who simply and honestly seek it.

Paul's words to the Thessalonians are not about wisdom, but describe one result of true wisdom: To the wise person of faith even death holds no terror. Our faith in Jesus' resurrection tells us we will all one day rise to new life in Christ.

Clergy Corner - Confirmed in a Faithful Community

In recent weeks another group of our youth has started Confirmation Preparation. An orientation meeting of nearly 50 of our young people, together with their parents and sponsors was a great experience, bringing 3 generations together. Moved as I was by the whole experience, it also called to mind for me how things have changed in just 3 generations.

For my generation, the Church gave those of us who were born and raised Catholic a strong sense of identity. Catholicism told us who and what we were as human beings, as Christians, even as individuals. We were nurtured and sustained by that great maternal institution respectfully referred to as Holy Mother Church.

Our Catholicism was a worldview, a total system of thinking, feeling and behaving. You could as easily stop being Catholic as you could stop breathing. Oh, you might formally leave the Church, but you could not change the way you had been taught to look at the world, God, religion, or yourself.

Today, the Catholic Church is much different from two generations ago. Pope St. John XXIII's program of updating the Church succeeded far better than anyone imagined. Vatican II ushered in an era of ecumenism which broke down many barriers between the Catholic Church and other Christian denominations. The greater openness of the Church is good, and the greater acceptance of others is also good. But a Church without walls also has a harder time defining itself. Today, it is not so easy to say what makes a Roman Catholic different from other Christians.

Young Catholics two generations later have not always been told the real difference between our Church and the churches that their friends belong to. At some point in their life, they have to face a serious question – Why am I a Catholic Christian? The answer to that question, however, is not simple to find in our present age. But that is the central question in our Confirmation Program called Confirmed in a Faithful Community. For 2 years our youth will wrestle with the major tenets of our faith and what makes us who we are. It is not easy. So, we ask our Faithful Community to pray for our youth, always. The result at the end of the process is to feel the embrace of the Holy Spirit that brings such a beautiful meaning to life.
