

## ART HOMEWORK

**IMPORTANT!** From now on, I WILL PROVIDE THE DATE OF THE WEEK IT'S **DUE**. Also, to allow more flexibility across all age groups, students may now CHOOSE (except where specified) the media (Crayons, colored pencils, markers, paint, etc.) of their choice to do homework. To get full credit, **effort** must be evident. The page must be full. If subject is too small, consider doing several and/or include some sort of background of simple color, lines or patterns. If the work is well done and fills MOST of the page, SOME empty space is OK. Also, consider encouraging creating borders whether simple straight borders (easily made with a ruler) or something more creative. A Small thing floating in a sea of empty whiteness will not get graded well.

## Second nine weeks assignments

DUE week of Oct 22 Draw a detailed picture of your favorite ride or booth at the Cochon de lait

DUE week of Oct. 29 Design your own Halloween costume. Can be just a mask or the whole body

DUE week of Nov 5<sup>th</sup> Draw a birthday card for the New Orleans Saints who turn 52 on Nov 1<sup>st</sup> 2018

DUE The week of Nov 12<sup>th</sup> Most geometric shapes have straight edges and angles such as rectangles, triangles, octagons and hexagons. Fill your page with them and overlap some. this can be accomplished by first lightly drawing in pencil then erasing the parts of those you overlap. Then, color them using different colors for different shapes.

DUE NOV 19<sup>th</sup> Create an imaginary turkey with clothes, shoes and a hat. Give the Turkey a name at the bottom of the page. Preferably funny. 😊

DUE NOV 26 POINTILLISM: Create a land, sea, or cityscape **using markers** and ONLY dots to create the image. Remember, more dots for darker areas and less dots for lighter areas.

DUE DEC 3<sup>rd</sup> Create an image of a mother and her child – HUMAN OR ANIMAL. Don't forget background.

DUE DEC 10<sup>th</sup> TEXTURES: Make a collage of textures. (bumpy, rough, hard, soft, etc.) you can do rubbings and cut and paste them and/or find pictures of textures. Rubbings: Just take a piece of paper and pencil and find textures (wall paneling, sidewalk cement, brick, grating on a vent, tree bark, etc. place the paper on the surface and rub with the side of the pencil point (or crayon, marker)

DUE DEC 17<sup>th</sup> Anything you want that depicts Christmas
