"Which Day of the Week is Ash Wednesday This Year?"

I have been used to the question, "Father, what time is Christmas Midnight Mass this year?"...although for the last five years, our Midnight Mass has begun at midnight and no longer at 8 pm or 10 pm, as in earlier years. Usually, at this time of year, the question to our staff has been, "At what time do you distribute ashes this year?", and the response has always been: you can come to any of the three Masses this Ash Wednesday – 9 am, 12 noon, or 7 pm! You may have heard of a non-Catholic Christian Church in Charles County which has begun to distribute ashes at a drive-thru location. Yes, the receiving of ashes is a wonderful reminder that we are entering the forty days of the joyful Season of Lent. Yesterday someone asked me a new question: "Which day of the week is Ash Wednesday this year?".

This year, **Ash Wednesday** happens to be on the first day of **March**. How do we determine the date of Ash Wednesday? It is always linked to Easter Sunday: Ash Wednesday is the Wednesday (yes, it is always a Wednesday!) before the First Sunday of Lent, which is six weeks before Easter Sunday (allowing for 40 days of Lent), which is the first Sunday after the Paschal Moon, which is the first full moon occurring after March 21, a proxy for the day of the Spring equinox (end of the winter season when the length of day equals the length of night). It is not as complicated as it sounds and we will quiz you when you come to attend one of our three Masses on Ash Wednesday (March 1, this year). As the Easter Moon is on Tuesday, April 11 and therefore, Easter Sunday is rather late: April 16! The earliest date of any Easter Sunday is March 22 and the latest is April 25). There is a logic behind all this, as we know that historically Jesus' death is related to the date of the Jewish Passover, which is linked to the Paschal Moon.

This year our parish has chosen as a **Lenten theme**, one key verse from John's Gospel: "**Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!**" (John 1:29). Every parishioner is invited to meditate on this powerful exhortation from John the Baptist! In the last two months since Christmas, we have spoken a lot about the **Lamb of God**. You all remember Scott Hahn's book, "**The Lamb's Supper**", give to each family attending Christmas Masses at OLHOC and discussed on January 26. If you did not attend our parish discussion, or have just begun to read the book, we invite you to read the whole book during the forty days of Lent. If you have already read the entire book, we invite you to read the Book of Revelation (at least the passages most frequently quoted by Scott Hahn). If you have given the book away to a friend, we invite you together with the whole parish to **meditate on John 1:29**. We hear those words proclaimed by the priest every Sunday (or Saturday evening), right after the **Sign of Peace** and just before **Communion**. It is a special time to **adore Jesus**, the **Lamb of God**, really present in the **Eucharist**. It is a special time to remember that **Jesus dies** as a sacrificial **lamb** to take away all our sins and to prepare ourselves to **receive Him**. It is a special time to remember that Jesus instituted both **Sacraments: Reconciliation** (Confession) and **Eucharist**
