## Whoever Has Ears Ought to Hear!

Over the last two weeks and again this week, we have all been invited to hear Jesus speak to us through amazing parables, all from Matthew's Chapter 13. Jesus says to each one of us: "Whoever has ears ought to hear!" (Matthew 13:43). As Jesus sits down by the Sea of Galilee, large crowds gather around him. He then goes into a boat, sits down and speaks to the whole crowd, including ourselves, standing along the shore. Everyone is silent as Jesus speaks with such authority. He also speaks in parables as he knows how difficult it is for all of us to understand the meaning of life on earth and what happens afterwards. We all want to go to heaven. We all want to know how to reach heaven and be with God forever and ever. Jesus wants to explain to us the meaning of the Kingdom of Heaven. He uses many different parables so that we can get some grasp, some understanding of that Kingdom of God. He has already taught us how to pray to God our Father, asking Him "Thy Kingdom Come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven!". We are all ears. We do not want to miss a single word coming out of Iesus' mouth!

Some of his parables are easier than others to be understood. For the difficult ones, including the Parable of the Sower (two weeks ago) and the Parable of the Wheat and Weeds (last week), he even gives us an explanation. But as in any parable, even the ones He explains, we are challenged to think, to reflect. Every time we hear a parable, even if it is a familiar one (like the Mustard Seed), we may gain a different insight into that Kingdom of God we are all seeking to reach! Jesus is constantly challenging us. Whenever we hear the Word of God being proclaimed in church or in small Scripture prayer groups (as we have Tuesday mornings and Friday evenings), we need to open our ears, open our minds, open our hearts! It is not sufficient to hear the words, we need to ask the Holy Spirit to help such understanding touch our hearts and then move our hands into action. We believe that every word in the Scriptures (collected in both the Old and New Testaments in the Bible), though written by man, is inspired by God, so that we can reach some knowledge of God, our Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as well as some understanding of the meaning and purpose of our life on earth: coming from God and returning to God!

I invite everyone to open your Bibles this week and read the entire Chapter 13 of Matthew's Gospel. You may wish to read it together with members of your family or friends. You may wish to read it to alone at your own pace. Some of you have commented to me last week that it was hard, though good, to hear some of Jesus' messages, including the one in the Parable of the Wheat and Weeds, where Jesus makes it clear at the end of time, the time of Final Judgment, God will separate the good wheat from the bad weeds: the good wheat (the righteous) will enter the Kingdom of their Father forever, but the bad weeds (the evildoers) will be separated from God forever. The good news is that all of us, while
