Interesting Historical Facts of Saint Mary's Mother of God church by Father Garrett O'Brien.

EVER NOTICE? Saint Mary's has some wonderful art work and unique traits. Take a look at this monogram on the right side altar. It has the letters JMJ for Jesus, Mary and Joseph. First of all, this altar is adorned with a statue of the Sacred Heart. This tells us that at some point in the history of Saint Mary's the altar was changed from the Holy Family (now located by the confessional) to the Sacred Heart. Also notice the subtlety of the artist. Notice that the J on the left is placed over the M, while the right J is weaved into the M. This simple detail bears the theology of the HOLY FAMILY: Jesus is prominent and comes to the fore while Joseph and Mary humbly share the second place. Simple and beautiful.
