

ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Today's Gospel reading is a fitting reminder to all of us that it's not the amount of money we give to the Campaign but the faith and hope we have in the value of preserving our church building for another 120 years so that it can continue to be a spiritual home to all who come after us. Don't look to the neighbor on your left, nor the one on your right – your contribution will be perfect for you because it came from your prayerful discernment of your capabilities. ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT – TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 13TH 6:30 PM. FOLLOWING 6:00 MASS

If Jesus were actually visible in church, everyone would run to welcome him, but he remains hidden in the Sacred Host under the appearance of bread, because he is calling us to faith, that we may come to him in humility.

"The Blessed Sacrament is the 'Living Heart' of each of our churches and it is our very sweet duty to honor and adore the Blessed Host, which our eyes see, the Incarnate Word, whom they cannot see." (Pope Paul VI, Credo of the People of God)

Gospel Reflection ~ October 21, 2018

Jesus censures the scribes and Pharisees for their quest for honor. He does not forbid occupying the reserved places that correspond to persons in office, but he warns the faithful that we should take care to avoid hankering after honors. He also accuses the scribes of exploiting widows financially. Because the care of widows and orphans in Jewish society was of paramount concern, the second charge is a serious one.

Mark contrasts the scribes' behavior with that of a widow who donates to the Temple. Her monetary gift amounts to practically nothing, but it is all she owns, and thus its value in God's eyes is far greater than the donations by wealthier people. Here we see both a negative and a positive example of love and devotion: the scribes' behavior indicates that their service to God is a farce, and in seeking to profit only themselves, they love neither God nor neighbor. Jesus contrasts the scribes' ostentation with the woman's' right intention and generous spirit. As she gives the little which is her all, she becomes the model of one who entrusts herself to God. In the phrase "she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood," she becomes a Christological figure, anticipating the self-emptying of Jesus on the Cross for our salvation.
