Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ,

On Palm Sunday we enter Holy Week and welcome Jesus into our lives, asking him to allow us a share in his suffering, death and Resurrection. This is also the time we remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. This same event takes place every day when we come for the Holy Mass. We celebrate the mystery of faith. Christ's death and resurrection. Christ's death has salvific value. It was a death caused by sin, but it destroyed death and restored life.

The Gospel of today gives us the passion narratives. The passion narrative has long been recognized as the most significant portion of Gospels. The reason is that the very core of Christian faith is expressed in these chapters: namely the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. In this passion narrative we see the unfathomable love of God for us human persons shown in his beloved son Jesus. The meditation on these Paschal mysteries should enable us to do our own dying to sin and rising with Jesus, which will result in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption.

Proper participation in the Holy Week liturgy will also deepen our relationship with God, increase our Faith, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus.

• Stewardship Thought: Every one of us is talented in some way. Stewardship encourages us to use any talent we have to benefit an individual, the Church or the community.

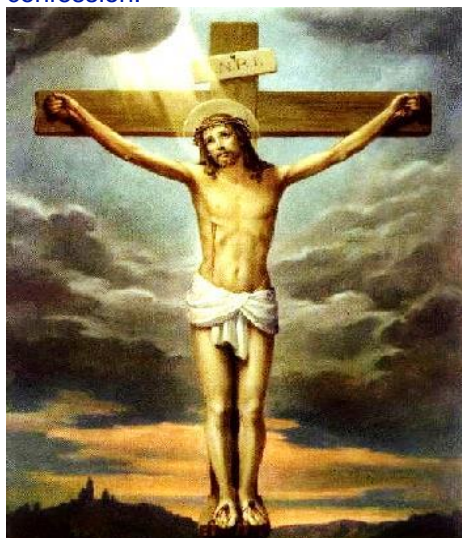
• Does your wife have a Will? In the event of a common disaster, the courts will look to your wife's Will in the distribution of your estate. Be prepared; get her Will written.



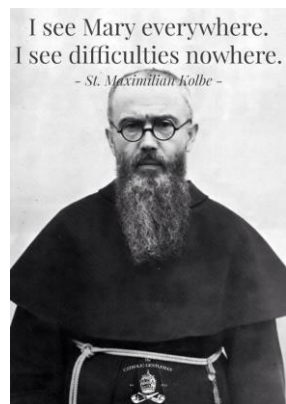

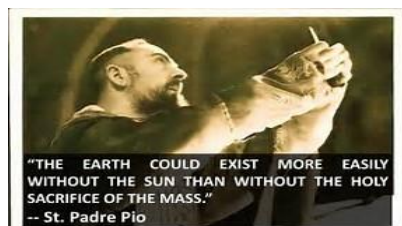

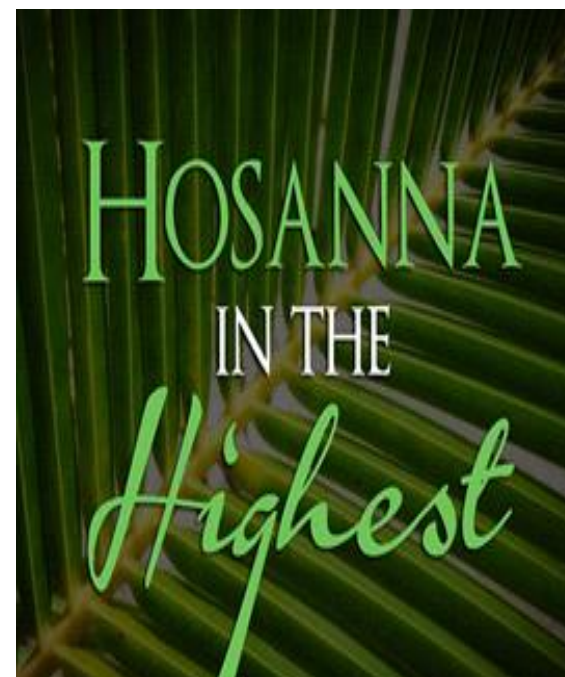
