Pope says entrepreneurship needed in face of 'scandalous poverty'

Pope Francis spoke of the need for creative entrepreneurship in the face of “scandalous poverty” Wednesday, stressing the importance of generosity with one’s possessions. “If there is hunger on earth, it is not because food is missing!” Pope Francis said in St. Peter’s Square Nov. 7. “What is lacking is a free and far-sighted entrepreneurship, which ensures adequate production, and a solidarity approach, which ensures fair distribution,” he continued. “Possession is a responsibility,” Francis stressed. “The ownership of a good makes the one who owns it an ‘administrator of Providence.’” “The possession of goods is an opportunity to multiply them with creativity and use them with generosity, and thus grow in love and freedom,” he said. Quoting the catechism, Pope Francis said, “Man, using created goods, must consider the external things that he legitimately possesses, not only as his own, but also as common, in the sense that they can benefit not only him but also others.”

The pope’s remarks on entrepreneurship and ownership came during a reflection on the seventh commandment, “Thou shall not steal.” In recent months, Pope Francis has dedicated his weekly general audiences to a series of lessons and reflections on the Ten Commandments recorded in the scriptural books of Exodus and Deuteronomy. “‘Do not steal’ means: love with your goods, take advantage of your means to love as you can. Then your life becomes good and possession becomes truly a gift. Because life is not the time to possess, but to love,” Francis said.

In a departure from his prepared remarks, he said, “If I can give ... I am rich, not only in what I possess, but also in generosity.” “In fact, if I cannot give something, it's because that thing has me - - I'm a slave!” he added. Pope Francis reflected upon St. Paul’s letter to St. Timothy, which says, “For the love of money is the root of all evils, and some people in their desire for it have strayed from the faith and have pierced themselves with many pains.”

Christ “enriched us with his poverty,” Pope Francis said. “While humanity struggles to get more, God redeems him by making himself poor: the Crucified Man has paid for all an inestimable ransom from God the Father, ‘rich in mercy,’” he continued. The love of money leads to vanity, pride, and arrogance, the pope warned, adding that “the devil enters through the pockets.” During his general audience, the pope greeted pilgrims from around the world, including a particular greeting for the participants of the first International Men’s Meeting in Rome. The pope also mentioned that this weekend will mark the 100th anniversary of the independence of Poland and said, “May you always be accompanied by the protection of Mary Queen of Poland and the blessing of God!”



Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre el sentido cristiano de la propiedad de bienes

En la Audiencia General de este miércoles 7 de noviembre en la Plaza de San Pedro del Vaticano, el Papa Francisco reflexionó sobre el sentido cristiano de la propiedad de bienes. **Texto completo de la catequesis del Papa Francisco:** Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días! Continuando con la explicación del Decálogo, hoy llegamos a la Séptima Palabra: "No robarás". Al escuchar este mandamiento, pensamos en el robo y el respeto por la propiedad de otros. No hay cultura en la que el robo y el abuso de bienes sean lícitos; en efecto, la sensibilidad humana es muy susceptible por lo que respecta a la defensa de la posesión. Pero vale la pena abrirnos a una lectura más amplia de esta Palabra, centrándonos en el tema de la propiedad de los bienes a la luz de la sabiduría cristiana. En la doctrina social de la Iglesia se habla del *destino universal de los bienes*. ¿Qué significa esto? Escuchemos lo que dice el Catecismo: " Al comienzo Dios confió la tierra y sus recursos a la administración común de la humanidad para que tuviera cuidado de ellos, los dominara mediante su trabajo y se beneficiara de sus frutos (cf. *Gen 1, 26-29*).

Los bienes de la creación están destinados a todo el género humano "(No. 2402). Y nuevamente: " El *destino universal de los bienes* continúa siendo primordial, aunque la promoción del bien común exija el respeto de la propiedad privada, de su derecho y de su ejercicio. " (No. 2403). La Providencia, sin embargo, no ha organizado un mundo en "serie", existen diferencias, condiciones diversas, culturas distintas, por lo que se puede vivir ayudándose unos a otros. El mundo es rico en recursos para asegurar a todos los bienes primarios. Sin embargo, muchos viven en una situación de pobreza escandalosa y los recursos naturales, mal utilizados, se van deteriorando. ¡Pero el mundo es uno solo! ¡La humanidad es solo una!

La riqueza del mundo, hoy, está en manos de una minoría, de pocos, y la pobreza, todavía más, la miseria y el sufrimiento, de tantos, de la mayoría. Si hay hambre en la tierra, ¡no es porque falten alimentos! De hecho, las necesidades del mercado a veces llevan a destruirlos, a tirarlos. Lo que falta es una iniciativa empresarial libre y con visión de futuro, que garantice una producción adecuada y un enfoque solidario que asegure una distribución equitativa. El Catecismo también dice: "El hombre, al servirse de esos bienes, debe considerar las cosas externas que posee legítimamente no sólo como suyas, sino también como comunes, en el sentido de que puedan aprovechar no sólo a él, sino también a los demás" " (N° 2404). Toda riqueza, para ser buena, debe tener una dimensión social. En esta perspectiva, aparece el significado positivo y amplio del mandamiento "No robarás". "La propiedad de un bien hace de su dueño un administrador de la providencia" (ibíd.). Nadie es dueño absoluto de los bienes: es un administrador de los bienes. La posesión es una *responsabilidad*: "Pero yo soy rico de todo..." – esta es una responsabilidad que tienes-. Y todo bien sustraído a la lógica de la Providencia de Dios es traicionado, traicionado, en su sentido más profundo.

Lo que poseo realmente es lo que sé dar. Esta es la medida para saber si administro bien o mal las riquezas; esta palabra es importante: lo que realmente poseo es lo que sé dar. Si yo sé dar, si estoy abierto, entonces soy rico, no solamente de lo que poseo, sino también de generosidad, generosidad también como un deber de dar riqueza para que todos participen de ella. De hecho, si no puedo dar algo, es porque eso me posee, tiene poder sobre mí y me esclaviza. La posesión de los bienes es una oportunidad para multiplicarlos con creatividad y usarlos con generosidad, y así crecer en amor y libertad. Mientras la humanidad se afana por tener más, Dios la redime haciéndose pobre: ese Hombre Crucificado ha pagado por todos un rescate inestimable por parte de Dios Padre, "rico en misericordia" (Ef. 2, 4, ver St.5, 11). Lo que nos hace ricos no son los bienes sino el amor. Muchas veces hemos escuchado lo que dice el Pueblo de Dios: "El diablo se cuela por los bolsillos". Se empieza por el amor al dinero, la fama que hay que poseer; luego llega la vanidad: "Ah, soy rico y presumo de ello"; y al final, el orgullo y la soberbia. Así actúa el diablo en nosotros. Pero la puerta son los bolsillos.

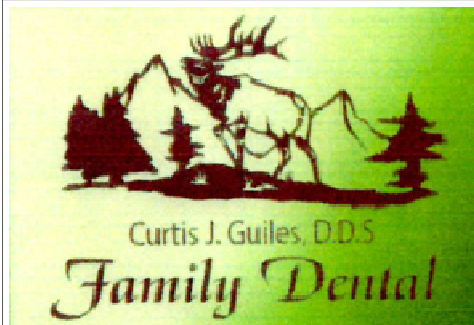
