The Rite of Sending at the March 3, 11AM Mass

On the first weekend of Lent, across the entire world, Catholic bishops will welcome the candidates and catechumens who have been sent by their parishes to gather together with their godparents and sponsors in what is known as the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion. On Sunday, March 3, at the 11AM Mass we celebrate the Rite of Sending. The Rite of Sending offers the St. Louise community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress that our catechumens and candidates have made, express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to our bishop with assurance of the parishes care and support. To send a catechumen or candidate to the bishop means that a parish has discerned that the person is ready to enter the Catholic Church.

In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelation makes reference to a "Book of Life," in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord Jesus and be baptized. Those who have already been baptized (the candidates) as Catholics or in other Christian denominations, had their names written in the Book of Life at their Baptism. In the Rite of Election, those preparing for Baptism (the catechumens) are invited to come forward and sign a book, which we call the "Book of the Elect," as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen of God.
