

# SEVEN THEMES OF CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

# V. Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

# VI. The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected--the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative.

# VII. Care for God's Creation

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of Gods creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

#### ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days of the liturgical calendar. It opens Lent, a season of preparation for the celebration of the central mysteries of our Catholic Faith, the suffering and death of Jesus and his rising from the dead.

The gospel reading from the Ash Wednesday Mass speaks of three practices that the Church continues to promote for the observance of this holy season: giving alms, prayer and fasting.

Lent in the Church is a time of recognizing who we are, of facing our need to allow God to call us to conversion, deeper and purer faith and recognition of our need for God's mercy and compassion. In the earlier years of Church it has been seen as a time of immediate preparation for baptism for those who are entering the Church at the Easter Vigil and as a time of penance for the forgiveness of sinners and their reception into the full life of the Church.

Ashes are generally administered during Mass as a visible symbol of penance. All – even those who are not Christians or who are excommunicated - are welcome to receive the ashes.
