Dear Parents,

As we begin our 2019 Lenten journey, we take time to reflect on how we can grow closer to God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. As a school, we will provide opportunities for all of our students to focus on each of these important aspects of our faith.

Prayer: Our students will attend Stations of the Cross throughout Lent. Students will also have the opportunity to go to Reconciliation. We will continue to hold our Friday all-school liturgies, as well as our early Thursday Mass each week. Students will be invited to reflect upon their prayer life during announcements each day when we read a Lenten reflection.

Almsgiving: Our students will be called to participate in giving to Ed Colina's Foundation, Journey, throughout Lent. The classes will be competing to see who can bring in the most money. Encourage your child to do chores at home for money that they could donate to this wonderful charity. We also had a speaker, Mrs. Kim Webb, from the Emergency Shelter of Northern KY. She talked to the students about homelessness and how many people in this area are affected by it. She shared some items that would help the shelter to provide for their guests. Each class is assigned an item to collect; please see an email that went out today for a list of items to donate. All items will be directly donated to the Emergency Shelter and used by the guests they serve.

Fasting: When we think of fasting, most of us automatically think of fasting from food. While this is a valuable way to fast during Lent, there are other ways, too. Consider fasting from things that you enjoy such as video games, social media, screen time. In its place, do things like more quality family time, family prayer/rosary, reading the Bible, and mindful meditation. Although we are giving up something that we enjoy, the benefits of drawing ourselves closer to Jesus during Lent far outweigh anything else.

A HUGE congratulations goes to two of our eighth grade students, Ryan Brogan and Jack Voelker, who are finalists in the Diocesan Pro Life Essay Contest. They will go to a banquet on March 21st, where the winner will be announced!

Lent and the Family

Family is the most important factor in a child's faith formation. During this season of Lent, focusing on family activities that promote spiritual concepts can help children understand Lent is a time to focus on spiritual things that bring us closer to God. As the Venerable Fulton J. Sheen once said, "*We can think of Lent as a time to eradicate evil or cultivate virtue, a time to pull up weeds or to plant good seeds.*"

Children are fertile ground for planting good seeds, but they can be a bit weedy. Family activities such as volunteering, praying for others, collecting and donating items to charity, giving up electronics for the day, or praying the rosary help us plant good seeds and eradicate the "weeds of evil."

Spring Uniform starts on April 1st

Students may start wearing their Spring Uniform on April 1st.

All Students Grades K-8

For gym class- Navy Blue gym style shorts

For Grades K-5

Boys – Any type uniform short, walking short, cargo short

Shorts – Navy

No faded shorts, appropriate length is no more than 4” above the knee

No jean material or gym shorts permitted, except on gym days

Girls – Shorts & Skorts – Any type uniform short, walking short, cargo short, uniform skort

Short/Skorts – Navy

No faded shorts, appropriate length is no more than 4” above the knee

No jean material or gym shorts permitted, except on gym days

No legging shorts allowed

For grades 6,7,8

Boys – Any type of uniform short, walking short, cargo short

Shorts – Khaki or Navy

No faded shorts, appropriate length is no more than 4” above the knee

No jean material or gym shorts permitted, except on gym days

Girls - Shorts and Skorts. Any type uniform short, walking short, cargo short, uniform skort

Short/skorts – Khaki or Navy

No faded short/skort, appropriate length is on more than 4” above the knee

No jean material or gym shorts permitted, except on gym days

No legging shorts allowed
