Lenten Regulations—Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics 18 years of age but not yet 60. Those bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to each one's needs; however, eating solid food between meals is not permitted. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics age 14 and older on all Fridays of Lent. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. The determination of certain days as obligatory days of penance should not be understood as limiting the occasion for Christian penance. The Spirit of the Lenten season should be maintained throughout the weeks of Lent.
