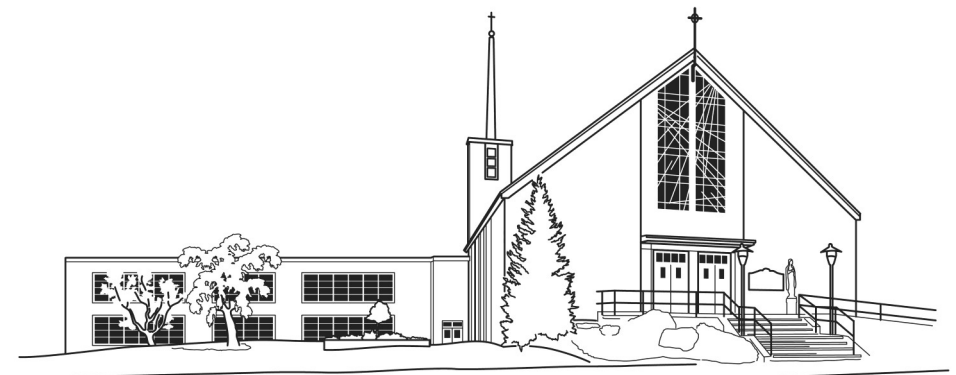

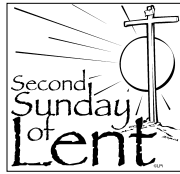

March 29, 4pm to March 30, 4:30pm**

It is even more urgent that you make an effort to drop by any time during these 24 hours because of the extreme changes the Massachusetts legislature is proposing to vote on soon.  
Do you believe. . .

- \* that an unborn child in the 7th, 8th or 9th month of development should be deprived of life, even though she is no physical threat to the life of the mother?
- \* That abortion should be legal through all nine months of pregnancy?
- \* That a newborn child who survives an abortion procedure should not be required to receive medical care?
- \* That a pregnant 14-year old girl should be able to get an abortion even though she may have been coerced by an abuser – because Massachusetts laws no longer require parental or judicial protection?
- \* That Massachusetts should increase tax funding for abortion?

Two bills before the Massachusetts legislature –S 1209 and H 3320 – would remove all current regulations for the abortion procedure in Massachusetts Law. Contact your legislators and say NO to these extreme measures.
