How the Legion of Mary assists the Priest

As a lay organization approved by the Church, the Legion of Mary is a "pastoral tool" ready for use by the priest. Started in Ireland in 1921, it has developed and spread to almost every diocese in the world and presently has a membership of some two million active members and 15 million auxiliary (praying) members. The local unit of the Legion, termed a praesidium, is established in a parish with the permission of the pastor and operates under his supervision. A **praesidium** usually has a blend of six to twenty lay people who come together each week for prayer, discussion, pastoral reporting and spiritual formation; they then perform some apostolic work under the guidance of the spiritual director (i.e., Pastor Jovito, deacon, religious sister, etc.). The Legion of Mary performs such works as visiting Nursing homes, home-bound parishioners, visit hospitals, and go out to Evangelize and bring their neighbors to Christ through the Blessed Virgin Mary.

"Last month on the anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the governor of New York signed into law a broad expansion of the practice of abortion in the state. The new law not only legalizes the abortion of a child for practically any reason during all nine months of pregnancy; it also removes any protection for a child born alive following an abortion procedure.
