**“THE SON OF MAN MUST SUFFER
AND BE KILLED.”**

Mark 8:27-33

**Sunday, September 16, 2018
24th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Hearing Jesus say he must suffer and be killed, Peter took him aside to rebuke him. But Jesus rebuked Peter, saying, “Get behind me, Satan. You are not thinking as God does, but as human beings do.”

Jesus clearly told his disciples that it was necessary for the Messiah to suffer and die in order that God’s work of redemption might be accomplished. How startled the disciples were when they heard this word. How different are God’s thoughts and ways from our thoughts and ways (Isaiah 55:8). It was through humiliation, suffering, and death on the cross that Jesus broke the powers of sin and death and won for us eternal life and freedom from slavery to sin and from oppression by Satan, the father of all lies and the deceiver of humankind.

If we want to share in the victory of the Lord Jesus, we must also take up our cross and follow where he leads us. What is the “cross” that you and I must take up each day? When my will crosses (does not align) with God’s will, then God’s will must be done. To know Jesus Christ is to know the power of his victory on the cross where he defeated sin and conquered death. The Holy Spirit gives us *faith* to know the Lord Jesus personally as our Redeemer, the *power* to live the Gospel faithfully, and the *courage* to witness to others the joy, truth, and freedom of the Gospel.

Lord Jesus, I believe and I profess that you are the Christ, the Son of the living God. Help me to embrace the crosses of my life. Take my life, my will, and all that I have, that I may be wholly yours now and forever.
